NANCY K. FILLMORE, a white female, date of birth home address Mulhall, Oklahoma 73063, telephone was contacted at her residence. FILLMORE was advised of the official identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, that being FILLMORE's observation of a RYDER truck in Mulhall on the morning of April 19, 1995, and FILLMORE's observation of a male who resembled composite number one. FILLMORE thereafter provided the following information:

FILLMORE went to work at the FARMER'S store located on Highway 77 in Mulhall at 7:00 a.m. on April 19, 1995, and noticed a medium sized RYDER truck parked across the street from the FARMER's store, and directly in front of the old bank building. sometime between 7:30 and 8:00, two males entered the store and FILLMORE may have sold a pack of cigarettes to an individual resembling TIM MCVEIGH. FILLMORE did not place any significance on the events of April 19, 1995 until she saw MCVEIGH'S picture on television at which time she had a "sick feeling" and realized she may have seen MCVEIGH. Before contacting the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), FILLMORE asked other people around town if they saw the RYDER truck on April 19, 1995. FILLMORE learned that ANN PETERSON, MARY HUNNICUTT, and KELLI KINDSCH also observed the truck on that morning. The FARMER'S store is visited routinely by a group of local people, some of whom may also have seen the truck. FILLMORE could provide no further information regarding this matter.
