thereafter provided the following information:	

KINDSCHI is a teacher at the Mulhall/Orlando Elementary School, and between 7:30-7:35 a.m., on April 19, 1995, stopped at Farmer's Store in Mulhall, to purchase a newspaper. KINDSCHI remembered going into the store to make a purchase and that there were more people than usual in the store, possibly 3-4 people who were young men. KINDSCHI could give no descriptions.

When KINDSCHI got out of her car to go into the store, she noticed a Ryder truck parked on Highway 77, facing South. Highway 77 is the main road going through Mulhall, and Farmer's Store is located on that street. The Ryder truck was parked next to the old bank building, also on Highway 77 and directly across the street from the Farmer's Store. KINDSCHI noticed the truck because it is unusual for that type of truck to be in Mulhall, which is just 3 miles west of interstate 35, and Highway 77 is not a very busy road. Also, the Farmer's Store has routine customers who come in for coffee in the morning, and the same vehicles are there every day. KINDSCHI noticed no other out-of-the-ordinary vehicles besides the Ryder truck which KINDSCHI characterized as a medium sized truck. KINDSCHI could provide no other information regarding this matter.
