

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent (SA) LAWRENCE R. NOLAN on May 2, 1995, at Newton, Kansas:

ESTELLA WEIGEL, 2962 Florida Avenue, Salina, Kansas, residence telephone number (913) 823-9302, and currently employed as a Medical Records Technician at PRAIRIE VIEW, INC., 1901 East First Street, Newton, Kansas, business telephone number (316) 284-6421, was contacted at which time she furnished the following information:

At approximately 7:45 a.m., on Tuesday, April 18, 1995, she was traveling on Interstate 135 proceeding to work in Newton, after having left her Salina residence. She was traveling south on Interstate 135. Between McPherson and Mound Ridge, Kansas, she had occasion to pass what she could only describe as a "big Ryder rental truck". She mentioned the fact that the license plate being displayed on the rear of the rental truck at this time was possibly from a so called "southern state", and it was possibly a State of Texas license plate. She stated that "the number that keeps popping in my head" is JHR 753, "or something like that". She stated that the Ryder truck was traveling "real slow".

She mentioned the fact that in front of the Ryder rental truck and also traveling "real slow" was approximately a 1978 to 1980 light beige Mercury automobile. She believes that the vehicle was a 2-door, and that it was possibly a Cougar model. She noticed that there was no license plate being displayed on the back of the vehicle. After she saw that there was no plate on the back of the car, she immediately looked in the back window of the car to see if there was a so called "temporary tags" displayed in this location. She stated there was not. She mentioned the fact she did not pay any attention as to whether there as a license plate displayed on the front of the car. To her, the vehicle looked "loaded down". She stated that she also thought she observed a rifle in the back window of the car.

She stated that she subsequently passed both vehicles at which time she determined that there were two people in the Ryder rental truck and one person in the car. She stated that she could not describe the people in the rental truck other than

the fact the driver appeared to be a white male. She mentioned that last night on television she saw a new composite drawing of UNSUB #2 as it relates to the Oklahoma City, Oklahoma bombing case. She mentioned that after seeing this artist composite drawing, she feels that the driver of the above-noted Mercury resembled UNSUB #2.

She further mentioned the fact that she previously saw on television a Mercury which was associated with the Oklahoma City bombing case, in which the news media coverage had eluded to the fact that this car had been driven by TIMOTHY McVEIGH. She stated that the car she saw on television looked just like the car she saw on Interstate 135 as related above.
