


FBI bomber hunt nets two in dawn raid

finally tracked down the missing Oklahoma City bombing suspect John Doe Two, swooped on a Missouri motel at dawn yesterday and arrested two men whom they described as "material witnesses" in the

"They have been arrested on probable cause that they possess information related to the bombing," Janet Reno, the attorney-general, said yesterday. refusing to confirm whether John Doe Two was finally in custody.

The two men registered at the motel under the names of Gary Alan Land and Robert Jacks. Their names had been widely publicised by the FBI on television news bulletins the previous evening as alleged asso- the second bombing suspect.

"They were arrested without incident. Jacks and Land are co-operating with the FBI in the investigation and have agreed to be interviewed, and have friend of Mr McVeigh. provided consents to search of their property," Ms Reno said. But a law enforcement source

in Washington later said investigators were considering releasing them because the authorities were having trouble finding a basis to hold them.

Missouri was a huge relief to the FBI which was increasingly frustrated at the loss of momentum in the search for John Doe Two, 13 days after the bombing.


