ROBERT G. MILLAR, white, male, born August 16, 1925, President, Elohim City, Oklahoma was advised as to the identities of the interviewing Agents and that he was being interviewed concerning the bombing of the Federal Building in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on April 19, 1995. MILLAR was contacted at the Best Western Motel, Sallisaw, Oklahoma and interviewed in Room 208 in accordance with prior telephonic arrangements. MILLAR provided the following information:

In the future, it would be helpful if he were not telephoned at 918/427-1972 as that number is very busy with calls relating to their trucking company.

RICHARD REYNA (Phonetic), Defense Investigator, has been to Elohim City about four times conducting interviews. During one of these visits, REYNA quoted a conversation in such detail that one of the ladies at Elohim City was reminded of a telephonic conversation in the general time frame of the April 5, 1995 call. The lady recalls that this call was for ANDY STRASSMEIR, but cannot recall a lot of detail.

STRASSMEIR became associated with Elohim City through KIRK LYONS, attorney, who was in Houston, Texas at the time. STRASSMEIR was staying with LYONS. LYONS is a friend of his (MILLAR). STRASSMEIR stayed at Elohim City a couple of years. He cannot remember exactly when in 1995 STRASSMEIR left Elohim City, but it was not as if STRASSMEIR left in a state of flight. KIRK LYONS had moved to Black Mountain, North Carolina and STRASSMEIR wanted to join LYONS. A female preacher, named LESLIE (Last Name Unknown), had been visiting Elohim City and was traveling to North Carolina, thus providing the opportunity for STRASSMEIR to reach North Carolina.

STRASSMEIR became associated with LYONS when LYONS was traveling and speaking in Germany. STRASSMEIR acted as an interpreter for LYONS. As a result of this relationship, STRASSMEIR came to the United States.

STRASSMEIR did very little work while at Elohim City, even though he had no source of income. STRASSMEIR was primarily interested in weapons and the security aspects of Elohim City. One of STRASSMEIR'S favorite duties was to help "cover" arriving guests. MILLAR explained that when people arrive at Elohim City, there is usually one person who greets the arrival and one person who "covers" the guest from another position. STRASSMEIR was not in charge of security as has been reported by the media, but STRASSMEIR did help ZERA PATTERSON with security.

There was nothing to lead MILLAR to believe that STRASSMEIR was ever an Intelligence Officer in the German army. STRASSMEIR claimed he was in the infantry and STRASSMEIR'S interests and actions at Elohim City were consistent with an infantryman.

He (MILLAR) cannot rule out the possibility that STRASSMEIR was an informant for either the United States or German government. One reason he considers this as a possibility is that FBI Director Freeh went to Germany a few years back and agreed to help the German Police with problems they were having with white separatist groups. STRASSMEIR could have been providing intelligence relating to LYONS and/or Elohim City to either Government. Additionally, he recalls that on one occasion a few months before the bombing, STRASSMEIR approached the Elders (of Elohim City) wanting them to fund purchase of automatic weapons from a male (not observed by MILLAR) who came to Elohim City and offered them for sale. The Elders told STRASSMEIR in no uncertain terms not to purchase illegal weapons. MILLAR later learned from a reliable source that the man offering the illegal weapons for sale was a Government Agent.

STRASSMEIR would routinely attend "gun shows" in surrounding cities in Oklahoma and Arkansas, such as Tulsa and Ft. Smith, with other young men from Elohim City. MILLAR recalls learning on one occasion when STRASSMEIR and, others were returning from a "gun show", a routine traffic stop occurred. They had numerous weapons purchased at the gun show in the vehicle. The Officer did not see the weapons. When he was apprised of this, he was very relieved that the weapons were not discovered by the Officer as it could have caused trouble.

He does not know ROGER MOORE, also known as BOB MILLER, or KAREN ANDERSON, however, he does not attend the "gun shows" He, personally, has little knowledge or interest in weapons.

When initially asked to provide the name of the lady referred to above, who apparently received the telephone call

from TIMOTHY MC VEIGH, he indicated he did not want to provide the name as he did not want to get her involved. After further discussion, and in order to get the matter permanently resolved, he indicated that the lady was his daughter-in-law, JOAN MILLAR, whose husband BRUCE MILLAR ran the trucking company. He said he would immediately call JOAN MILLAR and have her meet the interviewing Agents where the gravel road from Elohim City meets the highway.
