At approximately 8:30 a.m. on July 7, 1996, writer entered the west parking lot at the FBI building in Omaha and observed a female exiting a 1994 red Oldsmobile, Nebraska license 1-AC343. This vehicle is registered to Terrence A. Doukas and Jeanette A. Doukas, Omaha, Nebraska.

Writer asked the female exiting the vehicle if she needed assistance. After I identified myself to the female as an FBI employee, she identified herself as Jeanie Doukas and asked whether Special Agent (SA) Michael A. McCrery would be working on that day. She was advised that SA McCrery would not be in the office on Sunday, after which she stated that she had previously spoke to SA McCrery regarding a contact that she had on March 21, 1995, with Timothy McVeigh and an unknown subject that was accompanying McVeigh. She explained that she is an employee at the Crossroads Post Office, and McVeigh and the person with McVeigh, on March 21, 1995, had attempted to get passports from her at the post office. She advised that McVeigh did not have a proper birth certificate; and she, therefore, was unable to provide a passport to him. She stated that the other individual stated he would wait to get a passport when McVeigh had a proper birth certificate.

Ms. Doukas advised she could not provide any paper trail to show that McVeigh and the other male individual was in the post office on the above date, and stated that by the time she realized that McVeigh had been involved in the Oklahoma City bombing, the film in the surveillance camera in the post office had been reused. She stated that at the time she recognized McVeigh, she checked with Sears and they stated they kept no record of the passport photos or any type of a log regarding passport photos taken.

Ms. Doukas stated that she left for lunch shortly after attempting to assist McVeigh and the other male individual and stated she saw McVeigh's car in the parking lot near the post office.

Ms. Doukas advised that she has a hobby of doing chalk drawings and stated that she made a drawing of the unknown subject accompanying McVeigh. She stated that the chalk on the drawing was not set, but stated she wished to leave the drawing for SA McCrery. She stated that this incident has been bothering her since the time of the bombing and the identification of McVeigh and she simply needed to get the drawing out of her house and try to forget the whole incident. She stated that she brought the drawing in on this date because her husband was not at home.

Ms. Doukas was physically shaking and observably upset. She was advised that the drawing would be provided to SA McCrery. Ms. Doukas provided a work telephone number of and a home telephone number of
