COLUMBUS, Ohio - An alleged white supremacist gang leader was convicted Monday of two bank robberies that authorities say were part of the group's crime spree across the Midwest.

Peter Langan, 38, who called himself "Commander Pedro," was convicted of all five charges against him in the 1994 robberies in Ohio.

He still faces trial on charges in connection with 20 other bank heists in seven states.

Oklahoma City bombing defendant Timothy McVeigh's sister, Jennifer, has been quoted as telling the FBI that her brother helped plan some of the Midwest bank robberies and asked her to launder some of the loot. McVeigh's lawyer said McVeigh was only joking.
