

# Bomb Probe Activist Dies

Glenn Wilburn, who was so angry over the death of his grandsons in the Oklahoma City bombing and so mistrustful of the official investigation that he forced the opening of a new grand jury probe, died. He was 46.

Wilburn's death from pancreatic cancer came just a day after the panel began hearing witnesses looking into the possibility that there was a larger conspiracy and that federal agents had prior knowledge of the attack.

Wilburn's grandsons were killed in the day-care center of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building on April 19, 1995. Later Wilburn talked to several people who claimed to have seen others with Timothy J. McVeigh before the bombing. He and state Rep. Charles Key collected about 13,000 signatures that forced the impaneling of the special grand jury. McVeigh was convicted and condemned to die last month for murder and conspiracy in the bombing. Terry L. Nichols's trial on the same charges is set to begin Sept. 29.
