

Nichols accuses 3rd man in Oklahoma City bombing

Oklahoma City — Terry Nichols has written a letter to a woman who lost two grandchildren in the Oklahoma City bombing and accused a man never charged in the attack of providing some of the explosives used to bring down the building a decade ago.

Nichols, serving a life sentence for his role in the blast, said in the four-page handwritten letter that "I felt the record should be set straight." He claims Arkansas gun collector Roger Moore gave the explosives to Timothy McVeigh and provided additional bomb components recently found in Nichols' former Kansas home.

He sent the letter to Kathy Sanders, who has written a book about her own investigation of the bombing and corresponds with Nichols.

In a telephone interview Wednesday with the Los Angeles Times, Moore denied that he had any role in the 1995 tragedy.
