

## **Gun collector again denies bombing involvement**

Gun collector Roger E. Moore denied again Wednesday he had anything to do with the Oklahoma City bombing and said he is angry that convicted murderer Terry Nichols is still implicating him.

"He ain't got nothing to do. He'll just keep on with it until he thinks of a different way to figure out something else, Moore, 70, said from Florida. "Nothing I can do about it. He can sit there and do all he wants. ... He'd be smarter to go after ... John Doe 2. He'd have something then.

Nichols, 50, is claiming in letters that Moore supplied bomber Timothy McVeigh with explosives used in the 1995 bombing of the federal building.

Nichols' latest statement in an April 18 letter to victim Kathy Sanders received national attention Wednesday.

"Kinestik that McVeigh got from Moore was used in the OKC bombing! ... The Fed Gov't knows of Roger Moore's corrupt activities and they are protecting him and covering up his involvement with McVeigh & the OKC bombing! Nichols wrote Sanders, who lost two grandchildren in the building's day care.

Nichols is in federal prison in Colorado serving life sentences without the possibility of release for his role in the bombing.

Moore said of the 9:02 a.m. bombing: "I'm sleeping in bed when that happened. Totally surprised.
