During the afternoon hours of Monday, January 15, 1996 a physical surveillance was established in the vicinity of Harrison Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Participating in the surveillance and subsequent arrest of RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE, JR., male white, Date of Birth 02/25/1958 were the following: SAC THEODORE JACKSON, ASAC HENRY E. RAGLE, III, SAS HARRY M. BOYD, JR., JOHN HENRY LOVE, JR., MICHAEL J. ERBACH, RONALD L. DANIELSON, LETITIA A. JONES, JOHN CALVERT HOLLAND JR., KEITH D. COY, and Task Force Officers, TIMOTHY S. SPURLOCK and JEFFREY M. NELSON.

At approximately 5:45pm RICHARD GUTHRIE, driving a dark blue 1985 full size Ford van, bearing Ohio License WFE 277, was observed in the vehicle, using an outdoor pay telephone, at a UNITED DAIRY FARMER'S (UDF) store on Harrison Avenue at Johnson Road. GUTHRIE left the UDF lot driving south on Harrison Avenue and made a left turn on Race road. GUTHRIE attempted to avoid arrest by turning into a residential neighborhood. At this point, SA WOODS pursued GUTHRIE in an FBI vehicle with emergency flashers and siren on. GUTHRIE turned into Glencary Court, a cul-de-sac, and attempted to accelerate and exit the cul-de-sac by making a 180 degree turn. At that point the van was rammed by SA WOODS' vehicle and pushed into a snow bank.

GUTHRIE exited the van and began running between two residences, was ordered to stop by the first three agents chasing him, SSA WELKER, and SAs WOODS and ERBACH and placed under arrest at approximately 5:52pm.

GUTHRIE was advised of his Constitutional Rights orally by SA ROGERS.

Taken during the arrest was a stainless steel Jennings Firearms, INC., .22 caliber long rifle, semi automatic pistol, which had been in GUTHRIE's front belt line. The weapon, serial number #011360, was secured as evidence and determined to have been loaded with six rounds.

GUTHRIE's vehicle was taken from the immediate vicinity of 4581 Glencary Court as evidence and driven to a secure area within the basement garage of the Federal Building, Cincinnati, Ohio for inventory.

GUTHRIE was transported to the Cincinnati office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for processing by SSA WELKER, and SAs FLOHR and WOODS arriving at approximately 6:25pm.

GUTHRIE was photographed by SA LENGLE, and finger printed by SA ROGERS.

It was noted that GUTHRIE had a slight injury on his scalp which he had sustained during his initial stop in the van. The wound was cleaned off and noted to be very superficial by SA WOODS and FLOHR.

GUTHRIE was later advised of his Constitutional Rights in writing, waived those rights, and was formally interviewed.

At approximately 11:55pm GUTHRIE was transported and lodged at the Kenton County Jail, Covington, Kentucky by SSA WELKER, and SAS BOYD, FLOHR and ROGERS.

PLEA AGREEMENT v.

Judge S. Arthur Spiegel RICHARD L. GUTHRIE

It is hereby agreed by and between the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio and defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE, by and through undersigned counsel, that:

- 1. Defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE has entered a plea of Guilty to count 1 of the Indictment in CR-1-96-020 charging him with Bank Robbery in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and an Information, CR-1-96-051, filed in the Southern District of Ohio charging him with two counts of Armed Bank Robbery in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d), and one count of Using a Firearm During the Commission of a Crime of Violence, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 924 (c) (1).
- 2. Further the Pefendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE will enter guilty pleas pursuant to Rule 20 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure to the following additional charges that are or will be transferred to the Southern District of Ohio:
- An Indictment, CR-1-96-055, filed in the Northern District of Ohio charging him with one count of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).

- An Indictment, CR-1-96-059, filed in the Southern District of Iowa charging him with four counts of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. 2113 (a) and (d).
- An Information, CR-1-96-064, filed in the Eastern District of Wisconsin charging him with two counts of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).
- d. An Information, CR-1-96-052, filed in the Western District of Wisconsin charging him with one count of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).
- An Indictment, CR-1-96-065, filed in the Easter District of Missouri charging him with three counts of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).
- Informations, CR-1-96-060 & CR-1-96-072, filed in the Western District of Missouri charging him with two count of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).
- g. An Indictment, CR-1-96-066, filed in the District of Kansas charging him with one count of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).
- An Indictment, CR-1-96-053, filed in the District of Nebraska charging him with one count of Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d), and one count of Using a Firearm During the Commission of a Crime of Violence, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 924 (c)(1).
- A Superseding Information, CR-1-96-054, filed in the Western District of Kentucky charging him in count 1 with Armed Bank Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d).

j. An Indictment, CR-1-96-053, filed in the Northern District of West Virginia charging him with one count of Fraud in Connection With Identification Documents in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1028 (a) (3) and one count of Fraud in Connection With Access Devices, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1029 (a)(2).

Each violation of 18 U.S.C § 2113 (a), Bank Robbery, carries a maximum penalty of 20 years of imprisonment, a \$250,000.00 fine, a three year term of supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. Each violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d), Armed Bank Robbery charged in the Indictments and/or Informations set forth above carries a maximum penalty of 25 years imprisonment, a fine of \$250,000.00, five years of supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. The violation of 18 U.S.C. Sec 1029(a)(2) carries a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment, a \$250,000.00 fine, a three year term of supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. The violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1028 (a)(3) carries a maximum penalty of ten years imprisonment, a \$250,000.00 fine, a three year term of supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. The first Firearm violation, 18 U.S.C. § 924 (c) set forth in paragraph 1 herein carries a mandatory penalty of five years imprisonment, a fine of \$250,000.00, three years supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. That sentence must be served consecutively to the sentences imposed on all other counts. The second Firearm violation, 18

U.S.C. § 924 (c) as set forth in paragraph g. herein carries a mandatory penalty of 20 years imprisonment, a fine of \$250,000.00, three years of supervised release, and a mandatory \$50.00 special assessment. The sentence for the second Firearm violation must be served consecutively to the sentences imposed on all other counts. Accordingly defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE understands that he must serve 25 years in prison on the Firearms violations in addition and consecutively to the sentences imposed for the Bank Robbery violations (18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and 18 U.S.C. § 2113 (a) and (d)) and the Fraud violations (18 U.S.C. § 1029 (a) (2) and 1028(a) (3)).

In exchange for defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE'S plea to the nineteen Bank Robbery charges, the two fraud violations, and the two Firearms charges as set forth in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Plea soldement, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Mand will not file any additional charges against defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE regarding armed or unarmed bank robberies, federal firearms violations, or other violations of federal laws up to and through January 16,1996, about which the defendant has truthfully advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Further, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio Will move to dismiss Count 2 of an Indictment filed in case number CR-1-96-020. Further, the United States Attorneys for the respective districts named within will not file any additional charges of armed or unarmed bank robbery or the use of a firearm during the commission of a crime

of violence against defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE up to and through January 16,1996, about which the defendant has truthfully advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

- 4. Defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE will provide complete and truthful cooperation to the federal authorities regarding bank robberies, federal firearms violations, any group or organization whose goal is the overthrow of the United States Government or that engages in domestic terrorism, and any other violations of federal law about which he has knowledge. Said cooperation shall include, but is not limited to, giving a complete and truthful statement and testimony before a federal grand jury and at trial. and being subject to a polygraph examination at the request of the United States Attorney for any District in which such testimony is given. Such cooperation is subject to the limitations of Sentencing Guideline § 1B1.8. The United States Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio will advise the United States Probation Office of the extent of defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE'S cooperation before sentence is imposed.
- 5. Defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE understands that this Agreement is null and vo' if he makes any statement that is materially false, in whole or in part, or if he otherwise fails to comply with any of the terms of this Plea Agreement.
- In consideration of the Defendant's voluntary and truthful admission to authorities of his involvement of the instant offenses, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio recommends that the Defendant be given a

reduction of two (2) levels for acceptance of responsibility, pursuant to Sentencing Guideline § 3E1.1 (a). In the event the Defendant qualifies under 3E1.1 (b), the U.S. Attorney recommends that the reduction for acceptance of responsibility be increased by one (1) additional level.

- The United States Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio agrees to file a motion with the Court for a downward departure in sentencing, pursuant United States Sentencing Guidelines § 5K1.1 upon the substantial assistance of the defendant and his cooperation as set forth in this Plea Agreement. The United States Attorney agrees to make to the Court a nonbinding recommendation that pursuant to the downward departure the defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE be sentenced at a level of 24 which carries a range of 51-63 months, to be served consecutively to the firearms charges as set forth in this Plea Agreement. The United States Attorney and the defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE understand that any recommendation made to this Court is nonbinding and the Court retains sole discretion in any matter regarding sentencing. The United States Attorney may seek to set aside RICHARD L. GUTHRIE'S guilty plea and proceed on the Indictment should be fail to cooperate as in paragraph 3, above.
- 8. RICHARD L. GUTHRIE understands that the United States Probation Department will conduct a pre-sentence investigation, that it will recommend to the Court a sentencing range, and that the Probation Department's recommendations are not binding on the Court.

- 9. Defendant RICHARD L. GUTHRIE fully understands that the sentence imposed for the bank robberies and fraud violations will be in addition to, and consecutive to, the mandatory sentence of 25 years which he must receive for the two firearms charges.
- 10. No promises have been made to defendant RICHARD L.

 GUTHRIE that he will teceive probation or a lighter sentence on account of his plea of Guilty to the nineteen counts of bank robbery, the two fraud counts, and the two firearms counts.

On February 12, 1996, Richard Lee Guthrie, Sr., white male, date of birth May 3, 1927, place of birth Washington, D.C., Social Security Account Number 578-30-1187, residing at 47595 Comer Square, Sterling, Virginia, telephone number 703-421-1991, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents through display of credentials and was informed that he was being interviewed regarding the weapons and explosives which were located in his vehicle by St. Louis County Police earlier this date.

Guthrie, Sr., was orally advised and furnished the contents of the Interrogation; Advice of Rights form (FD-395). Guthrie, Sr., advised that he understood his rights and signed the aforementioned waiver.

Present during the interview at the St. Louis County Police Department, Precinct II, at Olive Road and Ladue Road were Special Agent Jan R. Hartman and Supervisory Special Agent David F. Cunningham. Guthrie, Sr., furnished the following information:

Guthrie. Sr., and his son, Nicholas Ward Guthrie had travelled from Virginia to Joplin, Missouri as a favor to his son, Richard Lee Guthrie, Jr., who is currently incarcerated for robbing banks. Guthrie, Jr., had written his brother Nicholas requesting that Nicholas pick up his belongings from a storage shed in Joplin, Missouri. Guthrie, Jr., indicated that this was all the belongings he had in the world. Guthrie, Sr., knew that his son, Nicholas, would honor that request, but he did not want him to go by himself because he knew that his son, Guthrie, Jr., had weapons. Nicholas is a convicted felon and is not to be in possession of guns.

Guthrie, Sr., confirmed that he was driving a 1973 Chrysler Newport four-door, green vinyl over green, bearing Maryland license plate ZRS-375, and that he is the sole owner of this vehicle. His son, Nicholas, was driving a pick-up truck. Currently, Guthrie, Sr., is living with Nicholas and Nicholas' wife, who is pregnant and due at any time. Guthrie, Sr., owns a one-bedroom condominium in Maryland that is rented out. Because he owns property in Maryland, he displays the Maryland license plate. Guthrie, Sr., has been living with Nicholas for approximately two years. They have lived in Maryland, Oregon, New Jersey, and eventually Virginia. Nicholas has a good job. He works seven to eight hours six days a week. He is off on Sunday.

Guthrie, Jr., who is currently incarcerated, calls collect every other day to Nicholas Guthrie's residence. Guthrie, Sr., had not seen Guthrie, Jr., since Christmas of 1991. Guthrie, Jr., went to many gatherings of different groups such as the Ku Klux Klan and Arayan Nation, but he did not join. He calls the Klan a bunch of idiots. He criticizes the Jews and the blacks. His prejudicism seemed to begin when he went into the Navy. Guthrie, Jr., had run-ins with blacks in the Navy. Guthrie, Sr., believes Guthrie, Jr., went through Navy Seal training and made it all the way to the last week.

In 1991, Guthrie, Jr., traveled around a lot. He frequented different farmer groups whom the government had pushed around. Nicholas told Guthrie, Sr., that Guthrie, Jr., did not correspond with his father so as to keep from getting his father into trouble. The only friends Guthrie, Sr., recalls that his son had were Pete and another boy named Smith. Guthrie, Sr., thought they were both nuts, although Smith was worse than Pete. They were all blatantly racist.

Shortly after Guthrie, Jr., was arrested, he began calling Nicholas and Guthrie, Sr. The first time he called was after his arrest, and he asked if they had heard what had happened. Guthrie, Sr., had not, and Guthrie, Jr., told him that he would be hearing a lot about it. According to Guthrie, Sr., his son was also a problem as a child growing up. Guthrie, Sr.'s, wife died, and Guthrie, Sr., had to raise the five children alone. The children were left unsupervised as he worked two to three jobs so as to keep food on the table.

For the past couple of weeks, Guthrie, Jr., has asked Nicholas to pick up his belongings. He told Nicholas that everything he has in the world was in the storage locker in Joplin, Missouri. Guthrie, Jr., sent Nicholas a letter outlining where the storage locker was and how to get into it. He gave them the combination of 1945 which could be used on all the locks. Guthrie, Jr., wanted his items removed before it was taken by police. He believed that the police would keep his belongings. Guthrie, Sr., also has a distrust for law enforcement in general. Guthrie, Jr., had advised that there were too many things to transport in one vehicle. Because Guthrie, Jr., did not want Nicholas to touch any guns, he agreed to drive down as well. He wanted to protect Nicholas from getting into any more trouble.

Guthrie, Sr., and Nicholas left Virginia on Saturday morning, February 10, 1996. They took Route 64 through Evansville, Indiana and stopped at the Motel 6 at Route 64 and 41 next to Denny's. Sunday morning they left for Joplin, Missouri. Nicholas was in a hurry to get back because his wife was ready to have their baby. Guthrie, Sr., was aware that Guthrie, Jr., had an old M1 and two .22 caliber weapons. When they reached Joplin, they located the storage shed which was across from Lowes Hardware. Nicholas tore up the letter sent by Guthrie, Jr., and threw it away.

At first, Guthrie, Sr., and Nicholas could not get into the shed with the combination 1945 and thought perhaps Guthrie, Jr., had not kept up the monthly payment fee. They contacted someone at the storage shed facility. The owners would not tell them how to correctly enter the storage shed. Nicholas and Guthrie, Sr., returned and tried the number one more time. worked. Guthrie, Sr., claimed that he did not have time to look over Guthrie Jr.'s belongings. He and Nicholas stuffed everything in the car and in the truck. Guthrie, Sr., was hoping to find gold coins which his son Guthrie, Jr., collected. He thought he could also sell the weapons his son had stored. Nicholas and Guthrie, Sr., opened the shed they realized that there was more in the shed than what was first believed. Nicholas was not happy about it because he was a convicted felon and was put in the position to handle firearms.

Nicholas and Guthrie, Sr., loaded their vehicles and left Joplin around 4:30 p.m. They had to get more money, so they called Nicholas' wife to wire more cash to them. Guthrie, Sr., intended on stopping in Columbus, Ohio to pick up some more belongings of Guthrie Jr.'s. Guthrie, Jr., had given them a telephone number to his landlord in Columbus. He rented under the name Ray Martin. Supposedly, the FBI had approved the release of this property.

When Guthrie, Sr., talked to Guthrie, Jr., on the phone after his arrest, Guthrie, Jr., admitted to robbing some banks although he advised that the authorities were trying to attach more. He also told Guthrie, Sr., that he provided the location of Pete LNU to authorities. Guthrie, Jr., said that the bombs left at the bank were jokes. They were a diversionary tactic. Guthrie, Sr., believes that with Guthrie, Jr.'s extensive training, he could have hurt anybody he wanted to. Guthrie, Jr., told his father that no one had ever been hurt. Guthrie, Sr., believes the money that was obtained in the bank robberies was probably used to fund some of the white supremist groups that Guthrie, Jr., associated with. Guthrie, Sr., got the impression that Guthrie, Jr., had no more money. He asked him if he was smart enough to put aside some of the robbery money for an attorney. Guthrie, Jr., had not. Guthrie, Jr., is concerned that he will be incarcerated with members of the Arayan Nation groups and is concerned about his safety.

Guthrie, Sr., has never been arrested and has never served in the military. He has five children. The oldest is Joseph Lee Guthrie, age 50, who lives in Sacramento, California. Second in line is Richard Lee Guthrie, Jr., who was born in 1957. Third is Donna Marie Guthrie, age 38. Donna Guthrie has a coffee shop in Bethany, Delaware. Fourth child is Nicholas Ward Guthrie, age 37, and the youngest child is Michael Anthony Guthrie, age 33.

The Shell credit card with account number 651 118 580, belonging to "COMAD AIR CONDITION COMPANY" was found during a January 18, 1996, consensual search of Richard Lee Guthrie's residence located at 585 Reinhard Street, Columbus, Ohio.

Analysis of the subpoenaed records revealed that all of the gas purchases were made within the states of Maryland, Delaware, Virginia and the District of Columbia.

Subsequently, on February 21, 1996, DICK RAB, COMAD AIR CONDITION COMPANY, 14410 Thorpe Lane, Upper Marlboro, Maryland, phone number 301-627-5033 was telephonically contacted regarding his knowledge of PETER KEVIN LANGAN and RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE, JR. RAB stated that the name GUTHRIE was not familiar to him but that the name PETE LANGAN was. RAB believed that LANGAN may have worked for him in the past but could not provide any further information.

RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE (Male, White, Date of Birth -February 25, 1958, Social Security Account Number 217-78-2716) having been arrested by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on January 15, 1996 was subsequently processed and interviewed at the Cincinnati FBI Office. Present during the entire interview session and all questioning was Special Agent (SA) DENNIS R. LENGLE, who had earlier identified himself and witnessed RICHARD GUTHRIE being provided his Advice of Rights. Prior to GUTHRIE being transported to the Kenton County, Kentucky jail, GUTHRIE granted an interview with agents representing the Department of the Treasury, United States Secret Service (USSS). SAS DAVID J. ZIMMERMAN and STEPHEN D. BECKMAN (USSS) also provided GUTHRIE his Advice of Rights and thereafter questioned GUTHRIE regarding his alleged "threats against the President of the United States." GUTHRIE continued his willingness to converse with both the FBI and USSS. provided the following information:

(Reference RICHARD GUTHRIE'S alleged participation in robbing Society Bank, 11355 Princeton Road, Springdale, Ohio on June 8, 1994)

GUTHRIE stated that he did not rob the aforementioned Society Bank. He advised of "being in the area" that is, temporarily visiting acquaintances in Miamitown (a town slightly west of Cincinnati, Ohio). GUTHRIE stated he did not participate in the robbery, or assist the individuals responsible. He acknowledged knowing of the robbery. He stated that his acquaintance, PETER KEVIN LANGAN and a second individual, probably JOE (Last name unknown) did the job. GUTHRIE described JOE as a white male, thirty one years of age, 5'11"- 6'0" tall, weighing 180 - 200 pounds, having very short hair and may have a beard. GUTHRIE advised that another individual named SONNY (Last name unknown) is known through association with PETER LANGAN. GUTHRIE implied that SONNY has assisted in bank robberies, but was not specific as which robberies. SONNY is a white male, approximately twenty five years of age, 6'3" - 6'4" tall,

weighing 225 -250 pounds and having short hair. Upon being asked if he (GUTHRIE) purchased the getaway car for the Springdale bank robbery, GUTHRIE replied, "No, it may have been JOE." SA LENGLE suggested that GUTHRIE left his expensive Icom America, Incorporated radio scanner in the getaway car. GUTHRIE denied that the radio scanner belonged to him. GUTHRIE was asked who he knows in Miamitown? He advised of visiting an individual named SHAWN KENNY, described as a white male, twenty five years of age. GUTHRIE provided no additional information regarding KENNY except to say, "He was just a mixed up kid. He (KENNY) was not involved with the Springdale bank robbery."

(Reference RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE'S alleged participation in other bank robberies)

GUTHRIE, speaking in generalities, would not comment regarding his alleged participation in any bank robberies. He admitted that he and PETER LANGAN were friends and they did "work" together. GUTHRIE stated, "Hypothetically speaking, I did eight to ten... Pete did all the rest." SA LENGLE showed GUTHRIE a map depicting mid-western United States with inscribed locations of bank robberies, suggesting that he and PETER LANGAN were solely responsible for robbing. GUTHRIE was asked, "Why were no banks robbed in Michigan, Illinois and Indiana?" GUTHRIE responded, "Because, as you know, the trunk lines at Indianapolis." GUTHRIE implied that telephone/radio communications were centered at Indianapolis, Indiana and owing to this "they" avoided this area. GUTHRIE offered no further explanation.

(Reference interview of RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE by USSS Special Agents ZIMMERMAN and BECKMAN, supra)

In response to SAs ZIMMERMAN and BECKMAN asking the question, "Did you make threats to President Bush during 1991 and 1992?" GUTHRIE replied as follows: "The only statements I made was me saying I'd be willing to take the Government by force. I'm not part of any conspiracy against the President." GUTHRIE advised that a couple of Georgia hillbillies named CHARLES STEWART and GARRY KENDLE made these allegations against him. They simply wanted to get him into trouble. GUTHRIE offered no specific reasons. GUTHRIE provided the USSS agents with his personal description.

RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE JR., male white, Date of Birth February 5, 1958 was interviewed at the Cincinnati office of the FBI subsequent to his arrest, at approximately 5:52pm on January 15, 1996, in the vicinity of 4581 Glencary Court, Cincinnati, Ohio,

Before any questioning began GUTHRIE was advised of his constitutional rights by allowing him to read out loud from an Advice of Rights and Waiver of Rights form. GUTHRIE stated that he was aware of his right not to make any statements and to have counsel appointed and waived those rights by executing a waiver of rights at 8:25pm.

It was explained to GUTHRIE that the purpose of the interview was first to determine the whereabouts of his associate, PETER KEVIN LANGAN, and then to discuss his bank robbery activities with LANGAN and others.

Taken as evidence incidental to GUTHRIE's arrest was his Motorola PAGEMART Nationwide pager, serial number #2060073-

GUTHRIE explained that he was not certain but believed that LANGAN was residing in the Kansas City, Missouri area and that they kept in touch through the pager system which was accessed through a toll-free number allowing them to leave recorded discrete messages for each other. Through this system they would arrange to meet at a specific date, place and time, and, that he believed that telephone information regarding from where the incoming calls were made could be obtained from the pager company.

GUTHRIE initially stated that, "I hope you don't find him," and that "I don't know where he is for that reason." The last time they personally met was about 1 1/2 months ago, on November 22, 1995. GUTHRIE would not say where they met, but believed that LANGAN was residing in the Grandview, Missouri area.

GUTHRIE was questioned about where he had been residing, stating that it was within three hours or so from Cincinnati but that he did "not want to put innocent people in jeopardy," and disclose where he has been staying. He stated that the last time he stayed in Cincinnati was at the Buckeye Motel across from the Green Township Police Department.

GUTHRIE was specifically questioned regarding his bank robbery activities, and was also asked whether he had seen a segment on the America's Most Wanted television program about the Mid-West bank robbers. GUTHRIE stated that someone had given him a copy of the program and that he was "pissed" because it had alleged that they had hurt some elderly lady, and that that was not true. According to GUTHRIE, it was just "PR." GUTHRIE was further asked; and clarified his intentions during the robberies by nodding with an affirmative yes to the interviewing agents, that he was in fact prepared to shoot it out with the police if necessary and they were "loaded for bear."

GUTHRIE commented that he did hear that there was a \$50,000 reward for "me and Pete and that should have warned me," implying that others would be willing to give them up for the reward.

At this point in the interview GUTHRIE stated that during the first week in December, 1995 he had made arrangements to meet LANGAN on Tuesday evening, January 16th, between 6:00 and 9:00pm in the Indianapolis, Indiana area.

GUTHRIE advised that he had met LANGAN in the same place on two previous occasions and that LANGAN would be driving a 1979 dark blue Chevrolet Van, full size, possibly a C-20 mode. bearing Iowa license plates which were registered to an electronics company in the county where Iowa City is located.

The meeting place is the parking lot area of a large older type mall and extended shopping plaza area, known as the Keystone Mall, located about five or six miles north of the Indianapolis beltway on Route 431 in the vicinity of 116th Street.

The parking lot is bordered by a strip mall, which ... adjacent to a Target department store, Nationwise auto parts store, a Hardee's restaurant, and a bank. GUTHRIE assisted 1 providing a diagram of the Keystone Mall area.

GUTHRIE last met LANGAN by the bank and met with him a restaurant in the strip mall area.

GUTHRIE advised that their procedure for actually meeting one another is as follows:

Each has a GLOBAL MOBILE RADIO SYSTEM (GMRS), made by MAXON, model #210, with ten preset channels. Around the agreed upon time GUTHRIE would transmit on one of the first five channels in the blind. LANGAN would use the search mode function on his GMRS system and reply on the same channel. The broadcasts would be made every 15 minutes on the quarter hour with GUTHRIE transmitting, "This is Red Baron," and LANGAN would usually respond and identify himself as, "Harley Davidson." GUTHRIE would indicate in coded terms, that "the fishing is fine" or words to that effect indicating that it was safe for LANGAN to enter the parking lot and meet him.

They could also exchange messages on the voice mail system if there were any changes.

GUTHRIE was aware that LANGAN had left messages this morning, Monday, January 15th, indicating that he was having mechanical trouble with his van, and clarified that the last time he met LANGAN was in Grandview, Missouri, off Interstate 71, by the "Grandview sign" located near a large gas station. GUTHRIE believed that LANGAN may have resided in Joplin, Missouri.

At this point in the interview, SAs LENGLE and FLOHR, continued the interview of GUTHRIE.

At 10:35pm GUTHRIE gave written permission, executing an FD-472 form, to consensually record the messages currently in his voice mail system, and provided the voice mail toll-free access number as; (800) 708-5276/pressing "0"/and then "1959", to play the voice mail messages.

A review of those messages indicated that on the morning of Monday, January 15th three messages were recorded as follows (GUTHRIE identified the first two speakers as PETER LANGAN, and the third one as himself leaving a reply to the first two voice mail messages):

(LANGAN) "Yeah, this is number two. I'm gonna be delayed by twenty-four hours on my arrival due to some mechanical problems. I should have them taken care of and I'll be on my way tomorrow morning. Should arrive tomorrow night. This is Monday, so I should arrive Tuesday and I'll go ahead and beep you again just to make sure you get the message.

At approximately 5:45pm RICHARD GUTHRIE, driving a dark blue 1985 full size Ford van, bearing Ohio License WFE 277, was observed in the vehicle, using an outdoor pay telephone, at a UNITED DAIRY FARMER'S (UDF) store on Harrison Avenue at Johnson Road. GUTHRIE left the UDF lot driving south on Harrison Avenue and made a left turn on Race road. GUTHRIE attempted to avoid arrest by turning into a residential neighborhood. At this point, SA WOODS pursued GUTHRIE in an FBI vehicle with emergency flashers and siren on. GUTHRIE turned into Glencary Court, a cul-de-sac, and attempted to accelerate and exit the cul-de-sac by making a 180 degree turn. At that point the van was rammed by SA WOODS' vehicle and pushed into a snow bank.

GUTHRIE exited the van and began running between two residences, was ordered to stop by the first three agents chasing him, SSA WELKER, and SAs WOODS and ERBACH and placed under arrest at approximately 5:52pm.

GUTHRIE was advised of his Constitutional Rights orally by SA ROGERS.

Taken during the arrest was a stainless steel Jennings Firearms, INC., .22 caliber long rifle, semi automatic pistol, which had been in GUTHRIE's front belt line. The weapon, serial number #011360, was secured as evidence and determined to have been loaded with six rounds.

GUTHRIE's vehicle was taken from the immediate vicinity of 4581 Glencary Court as evidence and driven to a secure area within the basement garage of the Federal Building, Cincinnati, Ohio for inventory.

GUTHRIE was transported to the Cincinnati office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for processing by SSA WELKER, and SAs FLOHR and WOODS arriving at approximately 6:25pm.

GUTHRIE was photographed by SA LENGLE, and finger printed by SA ROCERS.

It was noted that GUTHRIE had a slight injury on his scalp which he had sustained during his initial stop in the van. The wound was cleaned off and noted to be very superficial by SA WOODS and FLOHR.

GUTHRIE was later advised of his Constitutional Rights in writing, waived those rights, and was formally interviewed.

At approximately 11:55pm GUTHRIE was transported and lodged at the Kenton County Jail, Covington, Kentucky by SSA WELKER, and SAs BOYD, FLOHR and ROGERS.

I have neither a title, bill of sale or other indicia of ownership in the above-described vehicle, but hereby attest and aver that I was the rightful and legal owner of that vehicle as of June 1, 1994, and that I have not sold or otherwise transferred ownership of that vehicle prior to the date as indicated on this Release.

This Release is to be effective as of the date indicated below. My signature affixed hereto signifies my intent for now and for the future to release any ownership rights I may have had in the above-described vehicle.

GUTHRIE remains and moves some of his weapons, etc., into a Joplin, Missouri, U-Store-it facility, #C-48, with a lock

Around January 6, 1996, GUTHRIE returns to the Columbus safe-house and later contacts DANNY MCANINICH and attempts to recruit him into ARA and his bank robbery activities, and to form their own "cell." GUTHRIE did not think that MCANINICH was from the U.S. Army, and in town.

On Saturday evening, January 13, 1996, he met with KENNY at a Skyline Chili restaurant by a mall on the west side of Cincinnati and attempted to recruit him. They talked about obtaining military weapons and showed KENNY an M-1A Springfield manufactured weapon, which is a civilian version, black in color, of a military M-14, 7.62mm rifle, with folding stock, and loaded magazines. They made arrangements to meet again on Monday, at

GUTHRIE returned to Columbus, and then returned to Cincinnati on the afternoon of January 18, 1996, where he was

GUTHRIE stated that while incarcerated at the Kenton County Jail, Covington, Kentucky, he provided false information regarding a meeting with LANGAN that was supposed to occur in by FBI agents.

He then provided the location of the Columbus safehouse and a "Consent to Search" for the FBI, and later learned that LANGAN was arrested by the FBI at that location on January 18th after a shoot-out.

(GUTHRIE listened to two audio cassette tape recordings recovered from his blue Ford van subsequent to his arrest. GUTHRIE assumed from this that they did not use an IED, and may have altered their usual techniques somewhat.

LANGAN gave GUTHRIE \$500 which they had owed him, and split the rest among themselves.

RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE, male white, Date of Birth, February 25, 1958, was reinterviewed regarding his knowledge of the criminal activity of MARK THOMAS, SCOTT (STEDEFORD) and KEVIN (McCARTHY), and to review evidence taken during a search by the FBI of STEDEFORD's residence.

GUTHRIE first met MARK THOMAS around April, 1987, on a routine visit to the ARYAN NATION (AN) compound at HAYDEN LAKE, IDAHO.

In 1988, GUTHRIE called CARL FRANKLIN at the AN compound in an attempt to get rid of some old printing equipment that belonged to his father's printing business. A week or so later GUTHRIE was contacted by THOMAS who came to GUTHRIE's residence at 1503 Baylor Avenue, Rockville, Maryland, with a white male, MIKE (Last Name Unknown), and picked up a printing plate maker and a large table lamp. THOMAS had to make two trips to pick up this equipment.

GUTHRIE stated that he recalled sending new baby clothing items to MARK THOMAS, by U.S. mail, "about a dozen times" around 1988-89. GUTHRIE knew that THOMAS could use the baby clothes for his children and each mailing had about ten to fifteen items. GUTHRIE obtained the clothing as part of his K-Mart scam, and used them as a cover when checking out more valuable items with the cashiers. GUTHRIE would not return these type items and sent some of them to THOMAS.

GUTHRIE recalled that he may have also sent small amounts of money, \$200 to \$300, on a few occasions, to THOMAS with the baby clothes for support of THOMAS' white supremacist cause.

GUTHRIE was questioned regarding his recollections of a meeting with THOMAS, SCOTT, and KEVIN, that occurred in November, 1994, in the vicinity of Elohim City, Oklahoma.

GUTHRIE was shown a map and clarified that he stayed at a Motel 6, located by a Waffle House Restaurant, possibly at the

Van Buren Exit #5, I-40 and Arkansas 59, east of Elohim City, and recalled that he may have used the name of, CHARLES BRADDOCK, and a fictitious Maryland driver's license in that name.

GUTHRIE had been beeped by SCOTT and recalled that this was a spontaneous meeting at Elohim City to meet with him, THOMAS, and be introduced to KEVIN.

GUTHRIE arrived with PETER LANGAN, possibly on Wednesday after the November 11, 1994, Des Moines, Iowa, robbery, rented two single rooms at the Motel 6, and was driving his Chevrolet Station Wagon with Kansas license plates.

On the morning that he and LANGAN arrived, they had breakfast at the Waffle House Restaurant with THOMAS, SCOTT, and KEVIN, and then all talked in SCOTT's red Chevrolet van. GUTHRIE recalled that the van was not heated and that it was cold and rained heavily. At this meeting LANGAN did most of the talking, since he was head of the bank robbery department within their "cell", and, that there was no question that they specifically discussed preparation for their next bank robberies and their bank robbery activities in general.

GUTHRIE believes that because of the poor weather they may have also discussed their bank robbery activities in the motel room.

GUTHRIE further recalled that SCOTT had taken a towel from the motel room for some reason and was chastised by LANGAN because actions like that can bring unnecessary attention to their activities.

Regarding a July, 1995, meeting with MARK THOMAS, GUTHRIE reviewed a Pennsylvania road map and believed that he "THOMAS not south of Macungie, PA, but at a non-chain type mote possibly called the "Village Inn" in the vicinity of Exit #14, I-78, north of Macungie, PA. The motel was close to an Exxon station and a diner. GUTHRIE believed that he stayed five or days, arriving possibly on a Thursday and leaving the following Tuesday.

It was at this time that SUTHRIE gave SCOTT, and KE. \$1,000 each for their participat: in their "cell" and because he and PETER LANGAN had done very well on their previous robber in a subsequent conversation with SECMAS, that occurred, he believes, that Saturday, THOMAS winted to know more details at the bank robberies and their plans, and discussed wanting to along and monitor the next robbery. During this meeting, SCOTT

was upset with GUTHRIE for violating the need-to-know doctrine by providing too much information outside of those actually involved in the specific robberies. However, THOMAS appeared to want to become more personally involved in the actual robberies, but that SCOTT did not want him too. GUTHRIE also provided THOMAS with \$2,000 for his assistance in bringing SCOTT and KEVIN into their "cell".

GUTHRIE could not be absolutely certain if KEVIN was part of this later conversation with THOMAS and SCOTT.

GUTHRIE was questioned regarding the robbery of the SOCIETY NATIONAL BANK, Springdale, Ohio, that occurred on June 8, 1994, and recalled that LANGAN had previously purchased a book entitled MALCOLM and FIDEL at a flea market, and that they left it in the Chevrolet Citation getaway vehicle after the robbery. GUTHRIE stated that they did this in order to make law enforcement think that the bank was robbed by black bank robbers.

GUTHRIE was shown a photocopy of the cover of a book entitled <u>FIDEL & MALCOLM X; Memories of a Meeting</u>, that was found in the getaway vehicle after the Society bank robbery. GUTHRIE identified this as the same book which they left behind, and initialled the photocopy. (Attached)

GUTHRIE was shown a photocopy of a temporary KENTUCKY license plate issued to ED McCLEAN, when purchasing the Chevrolet Citation for the Society bank robbery. GUTHRIE stated that he recognized this temporary license as the one he obtained in Newport, Kentucky in the name of ED McCLEAN, when he purchased the Citation. GUTHRIE initialled the photocopy. (Attached)

GUTHRIE was shown a photocopy of a Bill of Sale for a 1980 Chevrolet Citation four door, purchased at MODERN MOTORS, Newport, Kentucky. GUTHRIE stated that he recognized this Bill of Sale and demonstrated how he signed it by writing left-handard back-handed with a scribbled signature. GUTHRIE initialle: the photocopy. (Attached)

GUTHRIE was shown evidence located in a black nylon Spalding brand gym bag containing numerous items of false identification, a protective vest, and other items, that was seized during a search by the FBI of the residence of SCOTT STEDEFORD.

GUTHRIE identified and initialled specific items, a: initialled a sample of each type of false identification, as follows:

Item #1) One United States Marshals Badge. GUTHRIE stated that item #1 was an original United States Marshals badge issued in the 1950's and that it has since been replaced by a new design. Guthrie advised that he purchased the badge from an Army/Navy store in Fort Smith Arkansas and that he had given it to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #2) One Blue U.S. Marshall T-Shirt. GUTHRIE stated that he recognized the label and printing on the shirt. GUTHRIE advised that he made several of the U.S. Marshall T-Shirts approximately one year ago and that he had given about one dozen of the T-Shirts to SCOTT STEDEFORD and TIM LNU (Last Name Unknown).

Item #3) One Large-Regular P.A.C.A. brand protective vest, white in color. GUTHRIE advised that he and LANGAN purchased this vest with "company funds" in the presence of SCOTT STEDEFORD at Conway Police Supply, Conway, Arkansas after the West Des Moines, Boatmans bank robbery. GUTHRIE stated that the vest was worn by STEDEFORD in the bank robberies committed after the Boatmans bank robbery in West Des Moines.

Item #4) A stack of approximately 34 General Medical Clinic Immunization Records. GUTHRIE stated that he had given some of the immunization records to SCOTT STEDEFORD and that he had the immunization records produced at a Kinkos in Overland Park, Kansas, and at a Kinkos on Battlefield Avenue in Springfield, Missouri.

Item #5) A stack of HYMAN Construction Company identification cards. GUTHRIE stated that he had the cards produced by AL DOZIER at a print shop located on Vine Street in Cincinnati, Ohio and that he had given some of the cards to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #6) A stack of blank identification cards in one of three colors, blue, grey or yellow. GUTHRIE advised that he made the identification cards in Springfield, Missouri and that he had given some to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #7) A stack of Health Plan identification cards. GUTHRIE advised that the Health Plan identification cards were reproduced from an actual identification card he had in his possession. Guthrie provided AL DOZIER with the actual identification card he had to be used as a sample and had DOZIER produce blank copies of the card. GUTHRIE also stated that he supplied SCOTT STEDEFORD with the above described cards.

Item #8) Blank APOLLO computer cards red and white in color. GUTHRIE stated that he had given some of the APOLLO computer cards to SCOTT STEDEFORD and that AL DOZIER made the cards for him at a print shop on Vine Street in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Item #9) A blue folder containing an Underground Manual with a blue cover and several copies of a NEWBORN ID form containing infant footprints. The Underground Manual contained information on how to make identification cards, a photo copy of the General Medical Clinic immunization record described as item #4 above and a photocopy of the Newborn ID form. GUTHRIE advised that the original title of the manual was "NEW ID IN ZOGLANDIA", a manual which he had written as a guide to creating false identification, and had printed in April, 1994, at a Kinkos in Roanoke, Virginia. GUTHRIE recognized the name OLIVER NORTH printed in the manual and remembered being questioned by a female about OLIVER NORTH while having the manuals printed. He also stated that he had given MARK THOMAS and SCOTT STEDEFORD blank copies of the NEWBORN ID form and that some of the forms were returned to him with infant footprints on them.

Item #10) An original Michigan registration form. GUTHRIE stated that he had acquired the forms in Ann Arbor, Michigan, had copies made in Cincinnati, Ohio at a Kinkos in Tri-County Mall, and had given some of the blank forms to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #11) A Health Plan ID card as described in item #7 with the name MICHAEL DIXON on it. GUTHRIE advised that he recognized the card but not the name MICHAEL DIXON. He also advised that he did not fill out the Health Plan ID card with the name MICHAEL DIXON.

Item #12) A stack of Insurance Identification cards with the emblem of an Elk on the card in blue ink. GUTHRIE advised that he had obtained an original Hartford Insurance identification card that he used as an example for reproducing blank cards from his sister who used to work for the Hartford Insurance Company. He also stated that he had given blank copies of the bogus insurance cards to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #13) One original Arkansas drivers license application form. GUTHRIE advised that he had stolen, by reaching over the counter, several hundred of the drivers license forms in 1993 at a branch of the Arkansas Department of Motor Vehicles and that he later gave several of the blank forms to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #14) Pad of blank Certificates of Baptism. GUTHRIE advised that the Certificates of baptism were purchased from the G.A. FUCHS Company, Detroit, Michigan, and that they were embossed with an embosser he had made with Saint Michaels, Troy, New York on the stamp. GUTHRIE stated that he gave SCOTT STEDEFORD approximately four to five pads of the Certificates of Baptism.

Item #15) A stack of individually numbered Certificates of Birth. GUTHRIE stated that he made the certificates at either the Kinkos in Springfield, Missouri or the Kinkos in Overland Park, Kansas and that he purchased the embosser used to emboss the certificates. GUTHRIE also advised that he had given some of the blank certificates to SCOTT STEDEFORD and that he recognized the manilla envelopes the certificates were contained in, as the same type he used to when he gave them to STEDEFORD.

Item #16) A stack of blank individually numbered Birth Certificates for the State of Georgia. GUTHRIE advised that he made the certificates at a Kinkos in Overland Park, Kansas or a Kinkos in Springfield, Missouri and that he had given some of the blank certificates to SCOTT STEDEFORD in envelopes similar to the one they are currently contained in.

Item #17) A stack of blank New York State Birth Registration forms. GUTHRIE believed that SCOTT STEDEFORD and KEVIN McCARTHY used the forms to obtain identification cards from somewhere down south.

GUTHRIE advised that he was given an original Idaho Certificate of Birth by MARK THOMAS and that he used the Idaho certificate as an example to produce blank certificates for other states. FUTHRIE stated that he made the certificates at a Kinkos in Overland Park, Kansas and a Kinkos in Springfield, Missouri. He remembered giving some of the certificates to SCOTT STEDEFORD.

Item #19) Certificates of Baptism forms, same as described in item #14 inside a blue folder, along with instructions for the ARYAN Insurance Company, and additional copies of insurance identification cards. It was explained to GUTHRIE that the purpose of the interview was first to determine the whereabouts of his associate, PETER KEVIN LANGAN, and then to discuss his bank robbery activities with LANGAN and others.

Taken as evidence incidental to GUTHRIE's arrest was his Motorola PAGEMART Nationwide pager, serial number #2060073-

GUTHRIE explained that he was not certain but believed that LANGAN was residing in the Kansas City, Missouri area and that they kept in touch through the pager system which was accessed through a toll-free number allowing them to leave recorded discrete messages for each other. Through this system they would arrange to meet at a specific date, place and time, and, that he believed that telephone information regarding from where the incoming calls were made could be obtained from the pager company.

GUTHRIE initially stated that, "I hope you don't find him," and that "I don't know where he is for that reason." The last time they personally met was about 1 1/2 months ago, on November 22, 1995. GUTHRIE would not say where they met, but believed that LANGAN was residing in the Grandview, Missouri area.

GUTHRIE was questioned about where he had been residing, stating that it was within three hours or so from Cincinnati but that he did "not want to put innocent people in jeopardy," and disclose where he has been staying. GUTHRIE was specifically questioned regarding his bank robbery activities, and was also asked whether he had seen a segment on the America's Most Wanted television program about the Mid-West bank robbers. GUTHRIE stated that someone had given him a copy of the program and that he was "pissed" because it had alleged that they had hurt some elderly lady, and that that was not true. According to GUTHRIE, it was just "PR." GUTHRIE was further asked; and clarified his intentions during the robberies by nodding with an affirmative yes to the interviewing agents, that he was in fact prepared to shoot it out with the police if necessary and they were "loaded for bear."

GUTHRIE commented that he did hear that there was a \$50,000 reward for "me and Pete and that should have warned me," implying that others would be willing to give them up for the reward.

At this point in the interview GUTHRIE stated that during the first week in December, 1995 he had made arrangements to meet LANGAN on Tuesday evening, January 16th, between 6:00 and 9:00pm in the Indianapolis, Indiana area.

GUTHRIE advised that he had met LANGAN in the same place on two previous occasions and that LANGAN would be driving a 1979 dark blue Chevrolet Van, full size, possibly a C-20 model, bearing Iowa license plates which were registered to an electronics company in the county where Iowa City is located.

The meeting place is the parking lot area of a large older type mall and extended shopping plaza area, known as the Keystone Mall, located about five or six miles north of the Indianapolis beltway on Route 431 in the vicinity of 116th Street.

The parking lot is bordered by a strip mall, which is adjacent to a Target department store, Nationwise auto parts store, a Hardee's restaurant, and a bank. GUTHRIE assisted in providing a diagram of the Keystone Mall area.

GUTHRIE last met LANGAN by the bank and met with him in a restaurant in the strip mall area.

GUTHRIE advised that their procedure for actually meeting one another is as follows:

LANGAN would use the search mode function on his GMRS system and reply on the same channel. The broadcasts would be made every 15 minutes on the quarter hour with GUTHRIE respond and identify himself as, "Harley Davidson." They could also exchange messages on the voice mail system if there were any changes.

A review of those messages indicated that on the morning of Monday, January 15th three messages were recorded as follows (GUTHRIE identified the first two speakers as PETER two voice mail messages):

(LANGAN) "Yeah, this is number two. I'm gonna be delayed by twenty-four hours on my arrival due to some mechanical problems. I should have them taken care of and I'll be on my way tomorrow morning. Should arrive tomorrow night. This is Monday, so I should arrive Tuesday and I'll go ahead and beep you again

The interview was conducted pursuant to a written agreement of cooperation and a proffer regarding his criminal activities. CREIGHTON, Investigator, Office of the Federal Public Defender, Southern District of Ohio, representing GUTHRIE's court appointed attorney, KELLY JOHNSON.

Participating during portions of the interview were the following: Special Agents (SA), SA WILLIAM J. DAVITCH, SA KENNETH E. MOORE, SA JOHN CALVERT HOLLAND, JR., and SA GARY R. FUHR. As set forth below, segments of the interview were conducted by the other interviewing SAs as noted.

GUTHRIE stated that around October, 1992, he and LANGAN robbed a Pizza Hut in Livonia, Georgia, that was set up by JAMES STEWART, who was an employee. GUTHRIE wore a ski mask and carried a .25 caliber pistol and got money from a floor safe by the cash register. LANGAN drove GUTHRIE's 1992 GMC pick-up and they both went first to GUTHRIE's trailer in Livonia and then to JAMES STEWART's residence where they divided up approximately \$2,300.

At this point GUTHRIE recalled that the United States Secret Service (USSS) searched his trailer in West Virginia and issued warrants for his arrest for credit card fraud, and that warrants were also issued for both he and LANGAN for the Pizza

GUTHRIE and LANGAN returned to Cincinnati. At that time, LANGAN was living on Biegler Street with Faith Ford.

Also during this period GUTHRIE makes a trip to Columbus, Ohio and signs a lease for 585 Reinhard Avenue on

About two weeks later, GUTHRIE meets LANGAN at the South County Center, St. Louis, and plan their next bank robbery.

20) Roosevelt Bank, 6969 South Lindbergh Boulevard, St. Langan. Robbed by GUTHRIE and

They both return to the Columbus, Ohio safe-house and during this period video tape armored car deliveries in anticipation of their first armored car robbery.

(GUTHRIE was shown a video tape taken from his blue Ford van subsequent to his arrest in Cincinnati on January 15, it was the tape of casing armored car deliveries in the Columbus, video tape.)

They both leave separately and meet again at the Pittsburg, Kansas safe-house where they make further plans to vacate that residence. LANGAN, still driving his white Chevrolet van, takes some of his belongings to Kansas City, and, during the Chico safe-house.

On December 8, 1995, GUTHRIE drives to Cincinnati to

During this time frame GUTHRIE stated that he remained at the Columbus, Ohio safe-house, LANGAN is still in Kansas City

and SCOTT (LNU) and KEVIN (LNU) are in Philadelphia, Penn. Arrangements were previously made for the three of them to return to Columbus, Ohio on December 14, 1995.

(GUTHRIE listened to two audio cassette tape recordings recovered from his blue Ford van subsequent to his arrest.

GUTHRIE identified tape #2, side A, as LANGAN speaking as Field Marshall Pedro, and side B as himself casing armored car deliveries in Dublin, Ohio, and mentioning the date of December 13, 1995. GUTHRIE identified tape #3, side A, as himself and LANGAN previously casing a Wells Fargo depot in Kansas City, armored car deliveries in Columbus, Ohio.)

On December 14, 1995, GUTHRIE was joined by LANGAN, SCOTT (LNU), and KEVIN (LNU), and knew that the three of them were planning a bank robbery in northern Ohio. Without GUTHRIE, they left for short periods of time driving SCOTT (LNU's) white suburban, and cased banks north of Columbus. During one of their vehicle and stashed it somewhere in the area of the intended robbery.

During the evening of December 19th, all three returned and GUTHRIE learned that they had successfully robbed a bank, possibly around the Toledo, Ohio area, and escaped with around after this, GUTHRIE was told by LANGAN, that this robbery had not been connected to them based on what he had read in the IED, and may have altered their usual techniques somewhat.

LANGAN gave GUTHRIE \$500 which they had owed him, and split the rest among themselves.

About two days later, LANGAN left for Kansas City in his white Chevrolet van and SCOTT (LNU) and KEVIN (LNU) left for Philadelphia, Penn., in the white suburban.

About two days later GUTHRIE returns to the Pittsburg safe-house in his blue Ford van and is there for Christmas morning. LANGAN joins him and moves more A his possessions back to Kansas City.

GUTHRIE remains and moves some of his weapons, etc., into a Joplin, Missouri, U-Store-it facility, #C-48, with a lock combination of "1945."

Around January 6, 1996, GUTHRIE returns to the Columbus safe-house and later contacts DANNY MCANINICH and attempts to recruit him into ARA and his bank robbery activities, and to form their own "cell." GUTHRIE did not think that MCANINICH was interested but learned from him that SHAWN KENNY was on leave from the U.S. Army, and in town.

On Saturday evening, January 13, 1996, he met with KENNY at a Skyline Chili restaurant by a mall on the west side of Cincinnati and attempted to recruit him. They talked about obtaining military weapons and showed KENNY an M-1A Springfield manufactured weapon, which is a civilian version, black in color, of a military M-14, 7.62mm rifle, with folding stock, and loaded magazines. They made arrangements to meet again on Monday, at 5:00pm at MCANINICH's apartment in Miamitown. Ohio.

GUTHRIE returned to Columbus, and then returned to Cincinnati on the afternoon of January 18, 1996, where he was

GUTHRIE stated that while incarcerated at the Kenton County Jail, Covington, Kentucky, he provided false information regarding a meeting with LANGAN that was supposed to occur in Indianapolis, Indiana, and on two occasions was transported there

He then provided the location of the Columbus safehouse and a "Consent to Search" for the FBI, and later learned that LANGAN was arrested by the FBI at that location on January 18th after a shoot-out. and morred to the company.

7) Society National Bank, 1355 Princeton Pike, Springdale, Ohio; June 8, 1994:

GUTHRIE stated that he and LANGAN arrived in the Cincinnati area from Pittsburg, Kansas, in early June, 1994 driving the blue extended Ford van. They were both familiar with the area and had considered robbing the Society Bank in the vicinity of the Tri-County Mall in the past, and on one occasion had been "locked and loaded" for a robbery of a Provident Bank, on Colerain Avenue, just off I-275.

During this trip they stayed at a Travelodge in Kentucky about five miles south of Cincinnati on I-75, renting two rooms for two to three days while they searched the area for banks to rob.

GUTHRIE purchased an older model Chevrolet Citation from a used car lot in Newport, Kentucky. GUTHRIE inspected the vehicle and went to LANGAN who was waiting in the blue Ford van and obtained \$500 cash from him. GUTHRIE went back to the lot and purchased the Citation from an older white male employee.

"locked and loaded" and prepared to rob the same Provident Bank on Colerain Avenue, but called it off, and stashed the vehicle in the Walmart parking lot on Colerain Avenue.

During their drive around Cincinnati they decided on the Society Bank on Princeton Pike. This bank was located just south of the Tri-County Mall, adjacent to another bank and just in front of a strip of stores and another shopping area. On the next day they retrieved the Chevrolet Citation and returned to the bank, "locked and loaded."

For this robbery, both GUTHRIE and LANGAN had fashioned an IED made from three flares, black tape, a clock device of some sort, and wires. GUTHRIE planted an inert World War II style grey steel hand grenade in the glove box and pulled the pin. It was intended that the spoon on the grenade would pop off when the glove box was opened and further frustrate and delay the police. GUTHRIE could not recall if the hand grenade had been filled with black powder and bottom opening plugged.

That morning both GUTHRIE and LANGAN were "locked and loaded," wearing full faced halloween masks, believed to be of Ross Perot and possibly Dan Quayle, and parked very near the front door of the bank.

There was some initial confusion as LANGAN got out of the vehicle and headed towards the bank and was spotted by a woman who saw him and began running away. LANGAN continued into the bank anyway; GUTHRIE followed but did not take the IED with him. GUTHRIE recalled that he had dropped his I COM scanner but put it back in the vehicle.

GUTHRIE was shown a photograph of the IED constructed for this robbery, but not used. GUTHRIE identified a photograph of this same IED that he subsequently used during the robbery of the Mercantile Bank, Springfield, Missouri, on July 7, 1994. GUTHRIE signed and dated the back of this photograph.

By the time GUTHRIE entered the bank, he believed through the front door as LANGAN did, LANGAN was already over the counter and rifling the teller drawers and placing the money into a canvas bag. GUTHRIE covered the banking floor and when LANGAN exited a side door, he exited the front door and entered the getaway vehicle and was joined by LANGAN.

They took their masks off and with GUTHRIE driving, exited the parking lot and turned right on the road that runs perpendicular to Princeton Pike heading for the switch site and the blue Ford van. As they left the parking lot a dye pack in the canvas bag exploded and LANGAN began throwing money out of the window in an attempt to get rid of the dye pack. GUTHRIE opened his door and was driving erratically because the vehicle was filling up with red dyed tear gas.

Approximately 1,000' down this road GUTHRIE turned into the parking lot of an office complex and he and LANGAN switched

to the blue Ford van. GUTHRIE went further north coming back out onto Princeton Pike about in front of the Tri-County Mall, to I-275 heading westbound. They joined I-71 and continued south, through Louisville, Kentucky and drove straight back to Pittsburg, Kansas, arriving around 1:00 or 2:00am the next morning.

While enroute GUTHRIE was upset because he realized that he had left his expensive I COM scanner in the Chevrolet Citation at the switch site, but at least had taken the IED with him in the "go bag" he had taken from the Citation.

GUTHRIE was asked if he recalled having been shown a photograph of the I COM scanner recovered subsequent to this robbery and stated that he did and that it was, in fact, the one he had left behind.

GUTHRIE recalled that they had netted only around \$2,100, which they split evenly, and burned the dye pack in a barrel at the Pittsburg, Kansas safe-house. He also recalled that it had taken a long time to clean the dye stains from the money.

One of the Halloween masks was dye stained and both of them may have ended up in either his storage locker in Joplin, Missouri, or in LANGAN's in Shawnee, Kansas.

GUTHRIE stated that during the robbery he carried a loaded blue Astra 9mm automatic and LANGAN carried a 9mm Taurus; both wore their bullet proof vests and baseball style gloves.

GUTHRIE was shown a bank surveillance photograph from the Society robbery that depicted a masked white male holding a weapon on the banking floor. GUTHRIE stated that it was a photograph of himself wearing a full face Halloween mask, black photograph of himself wearing a full face Halloween and holding a T-shirt, jeans, jungle boots, white baseball gloves and holding a handgun. GUTHRIE signed and dated the back of this photograph.

recovered subsequent to the robbery of the Mercantile Bank, 3230 E. Battlefield, Springfield, Missouri, and identified this device as the one he and LANGAN made for the Society robbery but had not used. GUTHRIE stated that they had used this IED device on their next robbery in Springfield. GUTHRIE signed and dated the back of this photograph.

Sometime not long after this robbery, GUTHRIE recalled that SHAWN KENNY had paged him repeatedly with "911," which meant

that he had a problem and wanted to talk to him. GUTHRIE contacted KENNY and on a subsequent trip to Cincinnati told him about the details of the Springdale robbery including the exploded dye pack and leaving his I COM scanner behind. KENNY informed GUTHRIE of an incident where he was stopped with another individual who the United Stated Secret Service (USSS) thought was GUTHRIE.

GUTHRIE made several trips during this time period to Cincinnati and contacted KENNY. On one of these trips, GUTHRIE gave KENNY some money to help him out and in an effort to recruit him to join himself and LANGAN in the bank robberies. GUTHRIE also gave KENNY money that he and LANGAN had taken during the robbery of the North American Savings Bank in Kansas, City, Missouri which occurred on 5/18/94. The money was dye stained and consisted of between \$50 and \$75 in \$5 bills. KENNY later told GUTHRIE that he had spent some of this dye stained money at a gas station near the trailer park in Miamitown where he was living and as a result he was contacted by the police.

The actual Social Security Card was not attached to the form. Guthrie recalled SCOTT STEDEFORD using the Social Security Card application, in the name of WILLIAM ROBERT STEVENS, to obtain a legitimate social security card (copy attached) and stated that STEDEFORD used GUTHRIE's rental post office box as his address to obtain the card. The address, 3318 S. Glenstone was a mail drop used by GUTHRIE and that he had picked up the original social security card from this post office box. GUTHRIE gave the original to STEDEFORD in April, 1995 and knew that STEDEFORD had used that social security card to obtain an Oklahoma drivers license. GUTHRIE recognized the blue folder as the same type he had seen STEDEFORD possess in the past.

At the conclusion of the interview, GUTHRIE provided hand writing exemplars.



GUTHRIE received training at the Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, Alabama, as an EOD student, however, he was only there one and one half months. From July 10, 1981, through February 18, 1982, GUTHRIE was assigned to the Navy EOD School in Indian Head, Maryland. On February 5, 1982, GUTHRIE was sentenced to 30 days in the Naval Station Brig, Norfolk, Virginia. Upon his release from the Brig, he was discharged from the Navy.

LENGLE, who had earlier identified himself and witnessed RICHARD GUTHRIE being provided his Advice of Rights. Prior to GUTHRIE being transported to the Kenton County, Kentucky jail, GUTHRIE granted an interview with agents representing the Department of the Treasury, United States Secret Service (USSS). SAs DAVID J. ZIMMERMAN and STEPHEN D. BECKMAN (USSS) also provided GUTHRIE his Advice of Rights and thereafter questioned GUTHRIE regarding his alleged "threats against the President of the United States." GUTHRIE stated that he did not rob the aforementioned Society Bank. He advised of "being in the area" that is, temporarily visiting acquaintances in Miamitown (a town slightly west of Cincinnati, Ohio). GUTHRIE stated he did not participate in the robbery, or assist the individuals responsible. He acknowledged knowing of the robbery. He stated that his acquaintance, PETER KEVIN LANGAN and a second individual, probably JOE (Last name unknown) did the job. GUTHRIE described JOE as a white male, thirty one years of age, 5'11"- 6'0" tall, weighing 180 - 200 pounds, having very short hair and may have a beard. GUTHRIE advised that another individual named SONNY (Last name unknown) is known through association with PETER LANGAN. GUTHRIE implied that SONNY has assisted in bank robberies, but was not specific as which robberies. SONNY is a white male, approximately twenty five years of age, 6'3" - 6'4" tall,

weighing 225 -250 pounds and having short hair. Upon being asked if he (GUTHRIE) purchased the getaway car for the Springdale bank robbery, GUTHRIE replied, "No, it may have been JOE." SA LENGLE suggested that GUTHRIE left his expensive Icom America, Incorporated radio scanner in the getaway car. GUTHRIE denied that the radio scanner belonged to him. GUTHRIE was asked who he knows in Miamitown? He advised of visiting an individual named SHAWN KENNY, described as a white male, twenty five years of age. GUTHRIE provided no additional information regarding KENNY except to say, "He was just a mixed up kid. He (KENNY) was not involved

(Reference RICHARD LEE GUTHRIE'S alleged participation in other bank robberies)

GUTHRIE, speaking in generalities, would not comment regarding his alleged participation in any bank robberies. He admitted that he and PETER LANGAN were friends and they did "work" together. GUTHRIE stated, "Hypothetically speaking, I did eight to ten...Pete did all the rest." SA LENGLE showed GUTHRIE a map depicting mid-western United States with inscribed locations of bank robberies, suggesting that he and PETER LANGAN were solely responsible for robbing. GUTHRIE was asked, "Why were no banks robbed in Michigan, Illinois and Indiana?" GUTHRIE responded, "Because, as you know, the trunk lines at Indianapolis." GUTHRIE implied that telephone/radio communications were centered at Indianapolis, Indiana and owing to this "they" avoided this area. GUTHRIE offered no further explanation.

In response to SAs ZIMMERMAN and BECKMAN asking the question, "Did you make threats to President Bush during 1991 and 1992?" GUTHRIE replied as follows: "The only statements I made was me saying I'd be willing to take the Government by force. I'm not part of any conspiracy against the President." GUTHRIE advised that a couple of Georgia hillbillies named CHARLES STEWART and GARRY KENDLE made these allegations against him. They simply wanted to get him into trouble. GUTHRIE offered no specific reasons. GUTHRIE provided the USSS agents with his personal description.
