The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents (SAs) MATTHEW H. SCHNECK and WALTER E. LAMAR in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on April 19, 1995:

On this date, SAs SCHNECK and LAMAR initiated the search for any potential surveillance camera video films which may exist depicting the events of the crime scene at the Alfred Murrah Federal Building.

The businesses located on Northwest 6th Street, such as RAY COLONE SERVICE, ACE LOAN SERVICE and FASHION CLEANERS all have surveillance cameras; however, according to contact with GEORGE GIANOS, who owns all of these buildings, all of the cameras are "dummy" cameras and nothing is video-taped.

SA LAMAR recovered a video tape from ANTHONY'S DEPARTMENT STORE. A. D. T. SECURITY SYSTEMS, located at 135 Northwest 6th Street has an external monitor; however, it is a monitor only and does not record.

Lieutenant ETHERIDGE advised that earlier in the day, he relinquished three tapes to Oklahoma City police officers and a SOUTHWESTERN BELL representative.

There were no cameras located in and around the First Methodist Church (which is being used as a morgue) and there were no available cameras at the Federal Courthouse.

Contact was made with LYNFORD KERLICK and RON KING of the Security Division of BANK OF OKLAHOMA. The BANK OF OKLAHOMA main branch has no cameras which would shoot outside the building. The BANK OF OKLAHOMA mini-branch and drive-through at 4th and Robinson Streets did have surveillance film which was relinquished to SA LAMAR.

JEAN LATHAM, Security Officer of the Oklahoma City Public Library located at 131 Dean A. McGee Building, relinquished copies of the surveillance tape to SA LAMAR. 174A-0C-56120 W- E-

Additional buildings in the area were scanned with negative results:

At 1924 hours, SA LOU ANN SANDSTROM turned over a tape which was taken from the REGENCY TOWERS located at 333 Northwest 5th Street. This was relinquished to SA LAMAR.

SA LAMAR and SCHNECK transferred these video tapes back to the command post in Oklahoma City, and advised SAs DENNIS M. CASTLEBERRY, JAMES L. NORMAN, JR. and MARY JUDD of their retrieval.
