The enclosed documents were reviewed under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA), Title 5, United States Code, Section 552/552a. Deletions have been made to protect information which is exempt from disclosure, with the appropriate exemptions noted on the page next to the excision. In addition, a deleted page information sheet was inserted in the file to indicate where pages were withheld entirely. The exemptions used to withhold information are marked below and explained on the enclosed Form OPCA-16a:

Synopsis: To provide information regarding the search of Terry Nichols' former home in Herington, Kansas and to inform receiving offices of Kansas City's subsequent investigation. This communication also serves to transmit FD-302's and investigative notes regarding the aforementioned investigation.

Administrative: Original copies of all documents associated with this communication are being forwarded to Oklahoma City for incorporation into case file 174A-OC-56120.

Enclosure(s): Enclosed for Oklahoma City are the originals and copies of nine (9) FD-302's and the original investigative notes and photographs contained in nine (9) attached FD-340 (1A) envelopes. Also enclosed for Oklahoma City are photographs depicting the search of Nichols' former home in Herington, Kansas. Finally, enclosed for all offices are aerial views of the search location where a .50 caliber rifle was recovered.

Details: On 03/25/2005, Kansas City Division, Wichita Resident Agency, received a Priority Lead from Jacksonville Division wherein a source of that office provided information regarding the location of explosives and other items related to "an impending act of domestic terrorism." These items were described as being located at 109 S. Second Avenue, Herington, Kansas, the former home of convicted Oklahoma City Bombing co-conspirator, Terry Lynn Nichols.

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On 03/31/2005, SA [redacted] conducted a morning briefing with members of the Wichita Joint Terrorism Task Force regarding the lead set forth by Jacksonville, and the investigative steps to be undertaken by the Wichita JTTF. The following time line provides an accounting of the actions taken by the Kansas City Division:

At 8:30 a.m. on 03/31/2005, the Wichita JTTF met to discuss investigative options related to the [redacted]. SA [redacted] tasked SA [redacted] and Task Force Officer (TFO) [redacted] to locate the current owner of the Herington, Kansas property, thought to be [redacted] who resides in [redacted] Kansas.

At 12:00 p.m. on same date, SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] arrived in [redacted], Kansas, but were unable to locate [redacted]. Further attempts to locate [redacted] were unsuccessful and agents departed [redacted] at approximately 2:30 p.m. The [redacted], Kansas Police Department assisted agents in locating [redacted], but again met with negative results. SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] departed [redacted] for Herington, Kansas, but left a note for [redacted] to call in case he returned.

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At approximately 3:00 p.m., SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] arrived in Herington, Kansas and upon locating the house, found it was for sale by [redacted] Real Estate, " [redacted] [redacted] was contacted using the number listed on the sale

sign and [] agreed to meet. Soon afterwards, [] signed a consent to search form and agents entered the home at approximately 3:30 p.m.

Using the information provided by the Jacksonville Division, agents began a diligent search of the home taking photographs of locations where the explosives were allegedly left by Nichols. At approximately 4:30 p.m., SA [] and TFO [] advised they had searched in the locations detailed by Jacksonville, but could not locate any explosives or their precursors.

SA [] advised [] and [] he would contact SA [] in Jacksonville in the chance he could obtain more specific information from his source that would assist the search. SA [] was able to contact his source and did provide additional information which was passed on to SA [] and TFO [] who, within minutes of receiving this additional information, located a cache of unknown items appearing to match the description of those detailed by the source information.

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TFO [] and SA [] carefully removed the outer coverings which obscured the items within, took several photographs with a digital camera, and pulled back to notify Wichita of their discovery.

Between 5:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., SSRA [] of the Wichita RA notified SAC Kevin Stafford of the discovery and then requested the FBI Bomb Technicians deploy to assist. SSRA [] and SA [] departed Wichita for Herington at approximately 6:00 p.m.

From 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., SA [] and TFO [] contacted the Herington Police Department who began to organize an evacuation of the houses near Nichols' former home. SSRA [] and SA [] arrived in Herington, Kansas at approximately 7:15 p.m. At the same time, the Bomb Technicians of FBI KC and representatives from the Topeka, Kansas Police Department Bomb Squad were en route.

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For the next two hours, briefings were conducted and preparations were made for the arrival of the bomb technicians. The Herington Fire Department provided excellent volunteer support blocking off roads for several square blocks and setting up floodlights. The Topeka Bomb Squad and FBI Kansas City Bomb Technicians arrived at approximately 9:20 p.m. and conducted a walk through of the home.

From 10:10 p.m. on March 31, 2005, to 5:00 a.m. on April 1, 2005, SA's [] and [] of the FBI, and

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Sergeant [redacted] of the Topeka Police Department conduct multiple entries into the home removing 505 electric detonators also known as "blasting caps." Also removed and X-Rayed, were packages of "Kinestik" liquid containers. Additional items were left undisturbed in the crawlspace until the search team could rest. Those items which were removed were placed back into the home and guarded overnight by SSRA [redacted] and SA [redacted]

Between 7:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on April 1, 2005, TFO's [redacted] and [redacted] arrived on scene and SA [redacted] provided a morning update to SA [redacted] acting SSA at the Domestic Terrorism Operations Unit (DTOU) at FBI HQ.

At approximately 9:30 a.m. members of the Kansas City Evidence Response Team (ERT) and SA [redacted], the Kansas City Division Public Relation's Agent arrived and received briefings from SSRA [redacted] and SA [redacted]

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Between 10:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m., the bomb technicians arrived as ERT began photographing the outside of the residence. SAC Kevin Stafford and Chief Division Counsel (CDC) [redacted] also arrived on scene. Concurrently, photographs taken the day previous by SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] are sent to DTOU by SA [redacted] [redacted] in Wichita, Kansas.

At 11:00 a.m., SA [redacted] and SGT [redacted] reentered the residence and discovered a military style ammunition can with unknown contents. Various attempts to safely remove the ammunition can were made and finally, at approximately 1:45 p.m., the can was opened with the assistance of an ordinance handling/removal robot. The can contained booklets, additional non-electric blasting caps, and a hotel comment card signed by Terry Nichols.

Once the crawlspace and adjacent locations were deemed safe by the bomb technicians, ERT entered the home and began a thorough search. From 2:00 p.m. until approximately 5:00 p.m., ERT dug through the basement crawlspace, searched through available spaces above the drop ceiling tiles, and logged all items recovered by the bomb technicians. Items were then removed from the home and taken to the Kansas City Division for further evidentiary processing.

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Once all items were removed from the home, [redacted] was escorted through the property and briefed by CDC [redacted] and ERT Team Member SA [redacted] about the search. [redacted] was advised only total deconstruction of the home could guarantee that all hazardous items had been removed, but barring that possibility, all possible locations had been searched. [redacted]

said she understood and signed the FD-597 listing the items which had been removed. A copy of the FD-597 was provided to [redacted]

At approximately 6:00 p.m., all parties departed Herington, Kansas and the Herington Police reopened the block for traffic and inhabitants.

The Wichita Resident Agency conducted an additional search related to items hidden by Terry Nichols: At approximately 11:15 a.m. on April 28, 2005, SA [redacted] received a call from SA [redacted] of the Colorado Springs RA regarding information he had obtained from a recent interview with Oklahoma City Bombing Co-conspirator, Terry Nichols. During this interview, SA [redacted] asked Nichols if he had hidden any other explosives or dangerous items aside from what had already been located at his former residence in Herington, Kansas. Nichols advised he had hidden or "stored" a .50 caliber rifle in an illegal dumping area near a riverbank approximately two miles north of Herington, Kansas. Nichols said he placed the weapon there on April 20, 1995.

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SA [redacted] also explained that Nichols had found a fragmentation grenade owned by McVeigh and placed it in an ammunition can after which he either a) "buried" it next to the .50 Caliber, or b) threw it in the river. Nichols further advised that en route to the .50 caliber's burial location, he had jettisoned McVeigh's Arizona license plate into a river crossed by a blacktop road leading north from Herington, KS.

SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] used a rough sketch and additional written information provided by SA [redacted] to conduct a map reconnaissance of the area. Multiple locations fit the description Nichols provided of his burial location, but one location in particular became an immediate focus of the search based on proximity and relationship to the written instructions. The written information provided by SA [redacted] was as follows:

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["A .50 caliber rifle was hidden on the side of the road approximately two miles north of Herington, KS [sic]. The rifle was buried on April 20, 1995 and had been stolen from the residence of [redacted]. Directions are as follows:

Go north out of Herington [sic] on a black top road which parallels Highway 77. Continue on the road past Highway 4 and over a river. Past the river approximately ½ mile, go east on a gravel road which is straight except for a bend which parallels a river. The river bend will be on the north side of the gravel road. The rifle was placed under a mattress/box spring half way down the river bank, approximately 15 or 20 feet from the river.

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The area where the rifle is stored may have been used as an illegal dumping ground for the local residents.

An anti-personnel hand grenade was either placed in an [sic] green ammunition can and left with the rifle or thrown into the river, below the stored rifle.

The river that is crossed while driving north out of Herrington [sic] contains the license plate of Tim McVeigh's vehicle. It was thrown into the river on April 20, 1995."

SA [] and TFO [] arrived at the probable search location at approximately 2:30 p.m. on April 28. Three possible locations along the riverbank were noted for search - the first being the one most likely to contain the buried weapons. A bed box spring was located on a steep embankment approximately twenty feet from the surface of the water. The incline on the bank was approximately 45 degrees or better requiring the use of a pulley (come-a-long) to remove the embedded box spring. Once removed, the soil underneath was loose, but a search revealed negative results. b6 b7c

From this location, the search progressed east along the steep embankment which was clearly an area where trash had been dumped for years. Much of the trash consisted of bottles, bailing wire, and fencing material which took time to remove and search. Another box spring was located east of the first location, but this was likely the internal spring of a pickup truck bench seat. This was removed and an additional search took place. Again, with negative results.

Continuing east along the embankment, TFO [] stated he had located what he thought was the case of a long rifle and upon exhumation it became obvious it was, indeed, the .50 caliber rifle. The rifle was contained in a flexible, but damaged black rifle case, wrapped in thin transparent plastic, also in poor condition. The plastic wrapping was similar to that which was used in the storage of the blasting caps and "Kinepac" discovered in Nichols' former residence. The rifle was located at approximately 4:45 p.m. Also, located around the weapon were various pieces of garbage with date stamps: A "Ziploc" bag and a bottle of homemade "hot sauce" were dated 1996. Given the layers of trash and sediment deposited there, it correlates with the date Nichols dumped the rifle.

Agents conducted an additional search of the area surrounding the .50 Caliber rifle, but met with negative results. If the grenade was stored in a sealed ammunition can, it may have floated downstream during the multiple times the area was

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underwater due to localized flooding. The meander on which the weapon was buried, may contain the ammunition can, but it will require additional equipment for a thorough search. It is also probable the ammunition can (which are not inherently waterproof), if submerged, is full of water and has negated the explosive properties of the grenade.

The road leading north from Herington is named State Route 218/Union Road and crosses the stream where Nichols said he threw out McVeigh's license plate. Time constraints and improper clothing prohibited a search of this area. Ten years of sedimentation will be problematic if such a search for the plate is required.

SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] took 35mm photographs of the search area and rifle and departed the scene shortly after 6:00 p.m. An overhead view of the search location is attached for review. The center of the image shows a meander causing a curve in the "unnamed street" which is actually 1000 Ave. The actual search location on this meander would be at the 5 - 6 o'clock position of the curve. The north/south hardball road just to the east of this location is Union Road/St Route 218 and where this road intersects the stream is the location where Nichols said he threw the license plate.

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Kansas City considers all leads associated with the requested searches to be covered.

This morning I received a call from [Redacted] who informed me that [Redacted] "the location of a bomb on U.S. soil" (approximate quotation), that he had asked [Redacted] to arrange for him to provide this information to an appropriate agency (FBI or BATF) but that no action appeared to have been taken and that the threat was imminent.

Because of prior efforts [Redacted]

[Redacted] intelligence which I am confident was fully credible,¹ and because at least one of these officials is now in a very senior position in Washington (general counsel of the FBI), I was concerned that [Redacted] would not be dealt with in good faith by federal agents.

On the assumption that a referral from a member of Congress was more likely to elicit a good-faith response, I immediately attempted to reach [Redacted] calling your Washington office, where I left my phone number when the receptionist elected not to receive any indication of the substance of the matter concerning which I was calling.

I then called a journalist acquaintance (associated with one of the major television networks), who called a member of a joint terrorism task force in California with whom he had had prior contact.

Late this afternoon [Redacted] was able to call [Redacted] to whom he gave somewhat more information:

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- He has been in contact with [Redacted]
- [Redacted] domestic, not foreign, terrorist.

- Action by federal authorities by Thursday, March 3, 2005, is imperative or "it's over with";

No. 08157-031), convicted and serving a life term as a coconspirator with Timothy McVeigh in the Murrah Building (Oklahoma City) bombing. Details: On 04/01/2005, [redacted] telephone [redacted] was contacted by Marquette RA Agents. [redacted] dba b6 b7C [redacted] agreed to be interviewed. Throughout the interview, [redacted] was cooperative but constantly derided the FBI for it's repeated failure to investigate their own misconduct, as well as, failing to followup on information he had provided to the FBI earlier regarding an explosives cache in Herington, Kansas.

It is important to preface the results of this interview with an observation concerning [redacted] and his surroundings.
