Dear Mr. Trentadue:

The enclosed documents were reviewed under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA), Title 5, United States Code, Section 552/552a. Deletions have been made to protect information which is exempt from disclosure, with the appropriate exemptions noted on the page next to the excision. In addition, a deleted page information sheet was inserted in the file to indicate where pages were withheld entirely. The exemptions used to withhold information are marked below and explained on the enclosed Form OPCA-16a:

1,034 pages were reviewed and 519 pages are being released.

Because of our significant backlog, we have given priority to processing only the main investigative file(s). If you want the references, you must submit a separate request for them in writing, and they will be reviewed at a later date, as time and resources permit.

## EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or

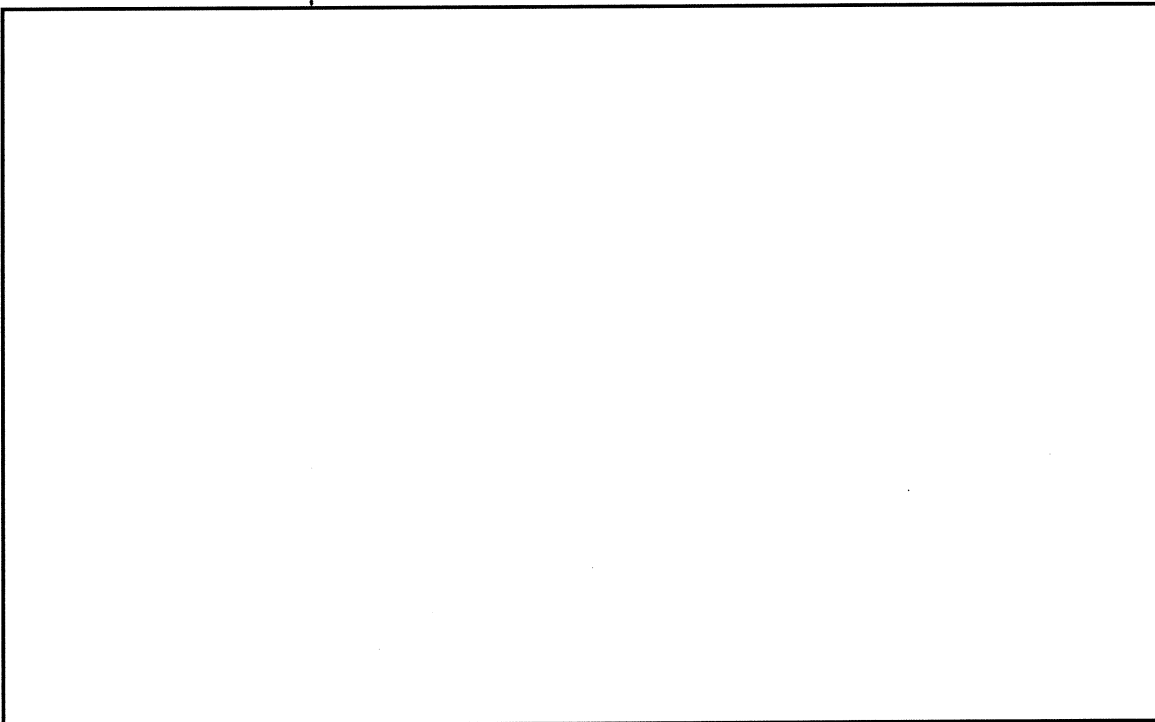

Details: Referenced communication advised recipients of Congressman Dana Rohrabacher's planned interview of inmate Terry Nichols at ADX. At the time, the Congressman intended to interview Nichols on 06/20/2005. As relayed in referenced communication, on 06/17/2005, ADX staff advised FBI Denver that Nichols provided written notification he wanted an attorney

present during any interviews he provided to the FBI, Bureau of Prisons (BOP), Department of Justice (DOJ), Congressmen or other U.S. Government representatives, or the media.

On 06/20/2005, the Office of Congressional Affairs (OCA) advised FBI Denver that Congressman Rohrabacher's office contacted Nichols' attorney to arrange for the Congressman to interview Nichols at a future undetermined date.

On 06/21/2005, OCA advised FBI Denver that DOJ anticipated the Congressman would interview Nichols at ADX on 06/27/2005, at an as yet undetermined time. OCA further advised contact with DOJ suggested Nichols' attorney would not be present for this interview. FBI Denver advised OCA that Denver would be available for this interview on 06/27/2005.

By way of background, the U.S. Attorney's Office in Denver, Colorado, arranged for Brian Hermanson, who represented Nichols during his murder trial in the State of Oklahoma to serve as Nichols' court-appointed attorney [redacted]

[redacted] to a Federal Grand Jury in [redacted]

On 06/21/2005, ADX staff advised FBI Denver that Hermanson's appointment did not cover Congressman Rohrabacher's anticipated interview. ADX staff also expressed concern with Congressman Rohrabacher interviewing Nichols on 06/27/2005, because ADX [redacted] and ADX [redacted]

[redacted] would have family visiting them on that date. [redacted]

[redacted] FBI Denver advised ADX staff to relay these concerns through their chain of command, ultimately to DOJ. FBI Denver advised OCA of this same information on 06/21/2005. FBI Denver has not received notification from ADX staff or otherwise that the date of Congressman Rohrabacher's interview of Nichols has been changed because of BOP's concern.

On 06/23/2005, Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) [redacted] Denver, Colorado, advised FBI Denver that on 06/17/2005, U.S. District Court Judge Boyd Boland, Denver, verbally denied Nichols court-appointed counsel for his interview with Congressman Rohrabacher. AUSA [redacted] notified DOJ Attorney [redacted] of this same information.

The planned logistics for this interview, as stated in referenced communication, have not changed, except for the interview date and the possibility an attorney will be present to represent Nichols. FBI Denver is awaiting notification from

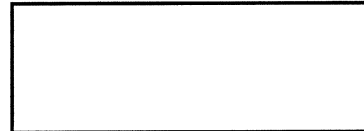
**Results of Examinations:**
