

# FBI finds explosives at Nichols' home

Agent: Items were there before attack

By JOHN SOLOMON

WASHINGTON — FBI agents searching the former home of convicted Oklahoma City bombing conspirator Terry Nichols found explosive materials, including blasting caps, that appear to date before the deadly 1995 attack, agency officials said Friday.

FBI officials — who were tipped that they may have missed evidence a decade ago — said the material was found buried in a crawl space of the house in Herington, Kan., which wasn't checked by agents during numerous searches of the property in the original investigation of Nichols and Timothy McVeigh.

"The information so far indicates the items have been there since prior to the Oklahoma City bombing," FBI Agent Gary Johnson said from Oklahoma City.

FBI spokesman Jeff Lanza said from Kansas that the materials were being sent to the FBI lab for analysis. FBI agents went to the property Thursday night and summoned a bomb squad after finding the potentially dangerous materials, Lanza said.

. The discovery, just three weeks before the 10th anniversary of the bombing of the federal building in Oklahoma City, which killed 168 people, is likely to prove a new embarrassment to the FBI, already criticized for causing a delay in McVeigh's execution after it found new documents in the case.

Nichols, who is serving multiple life prison sentences, hasn't lived there for years. He is a native of Michigan's Thumb.

One of Nichols' attorneys said Friday that the discovery was a hoax or a major failure by the FBI to find all evidence after searching the home numerous times.

"It's surprising. I would think they would have done their job and found everything that was there," said attorney Brian Hermanson.
