WASHINGTON • The FBI said Wednesday it will not reopen its investigation of the Oklahoma City bombing based on alleged statements from convicted accomplice Terry Nichols that a third man was involved in the 1995 attack.

Nichols, who conspired with Timothy McVeigh in bombing the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building, accused Arkansas gun collector Roger Moore of providing some explosives for the assault, according to a letter Nichols allegedly sent to a woman whose two grandchildren were killed in the blast. Moore said Nichols' allegations were false.

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Arkansas Woman Claims Nichols Has More To Say

LITTLE ROCK, AK -- Terry Nichols wants to reveal more about the Oklahoma City bombing, says a woman who released a letter in which the bombing conspirator accuses an Arkansas man of aiding in the plot.

The letter to Kathy Sanders, which she released this week, alleges that gun collector Roger Moore gave explosives to bomber Timothy McVeigh and provided additional bomb components recently found in Nichols' former Kansas home. "He wants me to come to the prison and he wants me to tell his story," Sanders said Thursday. "He's a quiet and introverted little man. He doesn't want to be in the bright lights, but he wants to set the record straight." Sanders' grandsons, 3-year-old Chase Smith and 2-year-old Colton Smith, were among the 168 victims of the 1995 bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building. An outspoken critic of the government's investigation of the bombing, she recently published a book, "After Oklahoma City," that explores her 10-year investigation into bombing conspiracy theories.

Sanders talked with Nichols by telephone two to three times a week while he was in custody in Oklahoma for trial on state murder charges. She said he was now ready to tell the full story behind the bombing _ but will only tell it to her because of the trust she has built with him. "Terry Nichols asked me to be a spokesperson for him and I am willing to do that," she said. So far, federal prison officials have turned down her requests to interview Nichols, saying it would be too disruptive. Nichols, 50, has been convicted twice _ in federal court and in an Oklahoma court _ and is imprisoned for life without parole. McVeigh was executed in 2001. An **FBI** spokesman in Kansas City has said the Nichols letter will not lead to a new investigation and there was no indication Moore provided explosives to Nichols and McVeigh.

Prosecutors say Nichols stole an estimated \$63,000 in weapons and other items from Moore's home that were then sold to help finance the terror plot. Moore, who underwent months of questioning after the bombing and who now lives in Roseland, Fla., was never charged and says he never gave explosives to Nichols or McVeigh. He denies any involvement with the pair or the bombing. Sanders' quest for information has garnered extensive publicity _ including a 2002 documentary on her visits to white supremacist camps and terrorist training compounds where McVeigh allegedly developed his anti-government views.

Some bombing survivors said Thursday they understand Sanders' desire for information, but don't agree with her tactics. "We know Kathy. She's a nice lady and she's been involved in this conspiracy stuff for 10 years," said Jim Denny, whose two children survived the April 19, 1995, blast. But Denny said he doesn't believe anything Nichols has to say. "Maybe people from the grassy knoll in Dallas were involved in it, too. They are still trying to prove that," he said, referring to conspiracy theories around the assassination of President Kennedy.

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK -- Saying he wanted to set the record straight, Oklahoma City bombing conspirator Terry Nichols has accused a man never charged in the 1995 attack with providing some of the explosives.

In a letter from prison, Nichols said Arkansas gun collector ~~Roger Moore~~ gave the explosives to bomber Timothy McVeigh and also provided additional bomb components recently found in Nichols' former Kansas home. Nichols wrote the letter to Kathy Sanders, who lost two grandchildren in the bombing and has been investigating it independently. A copy of the letter, first disclosed in a Los Angeles Times report, was obtained yesterday by the Associated Press from Mrs. Sanders' literary agent, Jim Baird. Mr. Moore has denied any involvement in the bombing and testified against Nichols about a robbery of guns and other property from his home.

In the early stages of the bombing investigation, the **FBI** looked at Mr. Moore because of his anti-government views and close relationship with McVeigh. He was never charged. Nichols' letter was part of recent correspondence with Mrs. Sanders. Nichols, 50, said in the letter that he wanted to speak out because he "felt the record should be set straight." The letter was dated April 18, the day before the 10-year anniversary of the federal building bombing that killed 168 persons. McVeigh was executed in June 2001.

Nichols said in the handwritten, four-page letter that **FBI** tests of bomb components found about a month ago at his former home in Herington, Kan., would support his claim that they came from Mr. Moore and Mr. Moore's girlfriend, Karen Anderson. "That case of nitromethane came directly from Roger Moore's Royal, Arkansas, home, and his prints should be found on that box and/or tubes, and Karen Anderson's prints may be there as well," Nichols wrote. "The Fed Gov't knows of Roger Moore's corrupt activities, and they are protecting him and covering up his involvement with McVeigh at the OKC bombing!" Nichols wrote. Miss Anderson also testified against Nichols about the robbery. **FBI** agents searched the Herington home on March 31.

Officials said agents found blasting caps and other explosive materials, apparently related to the 1995 attack, buried in a crawl space that hadn't been checked earlier. An **FBI** spokesman in Kansas City, Mo., Jeff Lanza, said yesterday that material found at the home, which he would not identify, was being examined for fingerprints and other evidence. He said that there is no indication this material came from Mr. Moore and that Nichols' letter would not lead to a new investigation. "We believe the information that came out of the original investigation, and we stand by the results of that investigation," Mr. Lanza said. Nichols has been convicted twice -- in federal court and in an Oklahoma state court -- and is serving two life sentences without parole.

WASHINGTON, DC -- Ending his silence, Terry Nichols, who was convicted of conspiracy in the Oklahoma City bombing, has accused a third man of providing some of the explosives used to kill 168 people at the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building 10 years ago.

Nichols, in a letter written from his cell at the government's Supermax prison in Colorado, said Arkansas gun collector Roger Moore donated so-called binary explosives to bomber Timothy McVeigh that were used in Oklahoma City, as well as additional bomb components that recently were found in Nichols' former home in Kansas. The claim that a third man was involved in the plot comes as Rep. Dana Rohrabacher, R-Calif., chairman of the investigative arm of the House Committee on International Relations, has been collecting new evidence in the bombing. He said he would announce soon whether to open formal hearings into the April 19, 1995, tragedy.

He says Nichols' knowledge about other potential conspirators is central to his investigation, especially since the components found in March in a crawl space below Nichols' home remained undetected for nearly 10 years. Nichols has been convicted twice and is serving two life sentences without parole. His revelations are considered particularly significant because they came in letters he sent to a woman named Kathy Sanders, who lost two grandchildren in the bombing. Having just turned 50, Nichols wrote that he wanted to speak out about the bombing because the 10-year anniversary last month honoring the victims had passed and "I felt the record should be set straight."

Repeated attempts to find Moore for comment were unsuccessful Tuesday. The FBI in the early stages of its investigation took a hard look at Moore because of his anti-government views and close relationship with McVeigh. Moore has steadfastly denied any involvement in the bombing.

All,

At approximately 11:15 a.m. on 28 APR 2005, SA [redacted] received a call from SA [redacted] regarding information he had obtained from a recent interview with Oklahoma City Bombing Co-conspirator, Terry Nichols. During this interview, SA [redacted] asked Nichols if he had hidden any other explosives or dangerous items aside from what had already been located at his former residence in Herington, Kansas. Nichols advised he had hidden or "stored" a .50 caliber rifle in an illegal dumping area near a riverbank approximately two miles north of Herington, Kansas. Nichols said he placed the weapon there on 20 APR 2005.

SA [redacted] also explained that Nichols had found a fragmentation grenade owned by McVeigh and placed it an ammunition can after which he either a) "buried" it next to the .50 Caliber, or b) threw it in the river. Nichols further advised that enroute to the burial location, he had jettisoned McVeigh's Arizona license plate into a river crossed by a blacktop road leading north from Herington, KS.

SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] used a rough sketch and additional written information provided by SA [redacted] to conduct a map reconnaissance of the area. Multiple locations fit the description Nichols provided of his burial location, but one location in particular became an immediate focus of the search based on proximity and relationship to the written instructions. The written information provided by SA [redacted] was as follows:

["A .50 caliber rifle was hidden on the side of the road approximately two miles north of Herington, KS. The rifle was buried on April 20, 1995 and had been stolen from the residence of Roger Moore. Directions are as follows:

Go north out of Herington on a black top road which parallels Highway 77. Continue on the road past Highway 4 and over a river. Past the river approximately 1/2 mile, go east on a gravel road which is straight except for a bend which parallels a river. The river bend will be on the north side of the gravel road. The rifle was placed under a mattress/box spring half way down the river bank, approximately 15 or 20 feet from the river.

The area where the rifle is stored may have been used as an illegal dumping ground for the local residents.

An anti-personnel hand grenade was either placed in an green ammunition can and left with the rifle or thrown into the river, below the stored rifle.

The river that is crossed while driving north out of Herington contains the license plate of Tim McVeigh's vehicle. It was thrown into the river on April 20, 1995."

4/29/2005

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SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] arrived at the probable search location at approximately 2:30 p.m. on 28 APR. Three possible locations along the riverbank were noted for search - the first being the one most likely to contain the buried weapons. A bed box spring was located on a steep embankment approximately twenty feet from the surface of the water. The incline on the bank was approximately 45 degrees or better requiring the use of a pulley (come-a-long) to remove the embedded box spring. Once removed, the soil underneath was loose, but a search revealed negative results.

From this location, we worked east along the steep embankment which was clearly an area where trash had been dumped for years. Much of the trash consisted of bottles, bailing wire, and fencing material which took time to remove and search. Another box spring was located east of the first location, but this was likely the internal spring of a pickup truck bench seat. This was removed and an additional search took place. Again, with negative results.

Continuing east along the embankment, TFO [redacted] stated he had located what he thought was the case of a long rifle and upon exhumation, it became obvious it was, indeed, the .50 caliber rifle. The rifle was contained in a flexible, but damaged black rifle case, wrapped in thin transparent plastic, also in poor condition. The plastic wrapping was similar to that which was used in the storage of the blasting caps and kinepac discovered in Nichols' former residence. The rifle was located at approximately 4:45 p.m. Also located around the weapon were various pieces of garbage with date stamps: A Ziploc bag and a bottle of homemade "hot sauce" were dated 1996. Given the layers of trash and sediment deposited there, it correlates with the date Nichols dumped the rifle.

We conducted an additional search of the area surrounding the .50 Caliber rifle, but met with negative results. If the grenade was stored in a sealed ammunition can, it may have floated downstream during the multiple times the area was underwater due to localized flooding. The meander on which the weapon was buried, may contain the ammunition can, but it will require additional equipment for a thorough search. It is also probable that ammunition can (which are not inherently waterproof), if submerged, is full of water and has negated the explosive properties of the grenade.

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The road leading north from Herington is named State Route 218/Union Road and crosses the stream where Nichols said he threw out McVeigh's license plate. Time and improper clothing prohibited a search of this area. Ten years of sedimentation will be problematic if such a search for the plate is required.

SA [redacted] and TFO [redacted] took 35mm photographs of the search area and rifle and departed the scene shortly after 6:00 p.m. An overhead view of the search location is attached for review. The center of the image shows a meander causing a curve in the "unnamed street" which is actually 1000 Ave. The actual search location on this meander would be at the 5 - 6 O'clock position of the curve. The north/south hardball road just to the east of this location is Union Road/St Route 218 and where this road intersects the stream is the location where Nichols said he threw the license plate. Last night, after [Redacted] interviewed Nichols, Nichols sent a "cop out" (memo) to ADX staff, stating he was angry with the FBI and did not want to see [Redacted] again. Knowing this going in, Nichols talked to [Redacted] and [Redacted] for two and one-half hours. They believe they left on good terms with Nichols. Bottom line: Nichols said he had additional (new) information he wanted to tell us, but was not willing to relay it now. [Redacted] and [Redacted] told Nichols they would not meet with him again until Nichols told the BOP he wanted to meet with us and was ready to provide new, actionable information. Below are highlights:

- Nichols was angry because we pulled him out yesterday without scheduling the interview, and our doing the same today further aggravated him. He felt he was being manipulated, just as McVeigh manipulated him, and [Redacted] (the other inmate) manipulated him. He brought up the cop out. We told him we were not aware of the cop out. A lot of the time [Redacted] and [Redacted] spent with him was to overcome this issue.

- [Redacted] and [Redacted] told him the Congressman would probably be coming to interview him soon, and that we would be present for this interview. Nichols wants the Congressman to interview him, and said he wanted a copy of the transcript/report for review and for his records.

- Nichols thought we would run right out and arrest [Redacted] based on his information. [Redacted] and [Redacted] explained that investigations take time, and that a lot of information has to be collected before we arrest someone.

- [Redacted] and [Redacted] believe Nichols has new information, that he feels remorse for what he's done, that holding back on this new information bothers Nichols, and that he wants to tell someone this information. [Redacted] asked Nichols "Is there something you want to tell us?" Nichols replied affirmatively. [Redacted] asked, "Are you going to tell us?" Nichols replied affirmatively. They believe Nichols is trying to decide on what he believes to be the proper outlet for his information, whether it is [Redacted] of FOX, the Congressman [Redacted] or the FBI. They believe Nichols will ask BOP to have [Redacted] and/or [Redacted] come down to relay additional information within the next couple weeks.

[Redacted] and [Redacted] believe that if Nichols is comfortable with the Congressman, he will relay his theory regarding others being involved in OKBOMB to the Congressman. [Redacted] and [Redacted] believe that our allowing Nichols to talk to the Congressman will go a long way toward developing Nichols' trust for the FBI.

Yesterday, Nichols told a prison investigator that unless I had lab information, he really did not want to talk.

Nichols and I began by talking about family and Nichols agreed to talk which surprised me based on the review of [redacted]

Nichols provided a detailed written wiring diagram of the truck bomb.

Nichols afraid of revealing ID of John Doe#2. I spent a large portion of time convincing Nichols that anyone with a television knows he is talking about OK bomb and that it would be only a matter of time before their name is revealed. He liked that line of thought and I felt he was going to provide the name. I discussed his family security and his personal security which really wasn't received a well as I had hoped. I told him the FBI can talk to his family but I did not want to seem like we are harassing his family. He told me he felt I was sincere in my concern but that I was only one person and someone higher than me could suppress information.

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I discussed how investigations work if you do not catch the bank robber leaving the bank. It includes hard work, time and facts. He asked some questions about grand juries and I told him that prior to any grand jury, he would need to be ready to state the facts as time is precious in front of a grand jury. He was willing to meet and talk next Tuesday and was in a pretty good mood.

Nichols wanted to know if Inmate [Redacted] was going to be receiving any benefit for cooperation. I told Nichols that I did not have any information but do not believe that [Redacted] would benefit.

I told Nichols that the material recovered from his residence was in very bad shape and that the lab was working on the blasting caps. The nitromethane tubes did not appear to have any fingerprints that could be used for identification. I asked Nichols if the box of stolen nitromethane tubes was open when he stole them. He believed that it was but the contents was undisturbed. I think the light came on as to the possibility that no fingerprints of [Redacted] could be recovered if [Redacted] did not touch the contents.

Referral/Consult

I will continue to meet with him and obtain information even in small bits. I told him that I will be presenting theories that are out regarding OK Bomb and that he could help the victims and law enforcement. I told him I would be visiting more often and provide "actionable items" to agents who want to get questioned answered in Oklahoma City and around the country. He responded well. I am trying to convince him that we are both seeking all the facts about OK Bomb but he must provide direction and facts.

I will see him on Tuesday.

My comment regarding pre-coaching Nichols was based on my misinterpretation of [Redacted] reply to my e-mail; specifically, development of a strategy for the Congressman's interview with Nichols.

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We do not believe Nichols will shut-down on us if he talks to the Congressman. [Redacted] has developed a good rapport with Nichols, appealing to Nichols' "country-folk" mentality, and bonding through their shared former residency in Michigan. Giving the Congressman access to Nichols now will hopefully give the Congressman what he wants, allowing him to move on to other interests. In a Washington Post (6/5) op-ed, former FBI domestic counterterrorism agent [Redacted] argues that domestic terrorists like Timothy McVeigh are not individual actors, but part of a larger network of right-wing extremists plotting terror attacks. [Redacted] writes, "The FBI has long maintained that Timothy McVeigh... was the prototypical 'lone wolf' terrorist," but "old loose ends and troubling new revelations about McVeigh's association with white supremacist groups have led many people to wonder whether a wider conspiracy was behind the bombing." [Redacted] adds, "'Lone extremism' is not a phenomenon; it's a technique, a ruse designed to subvert the criminal justice system." McVeigh's "act of lone extremism was part of an ongoing conspiracy that continues to inspire violent attacks to this day, and to close our eyes to this conspiracy is to deny reality. 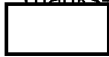

Report: Nichols declines to testify before federal grand jury

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) - Oklahoma City bombing conspirator Terry Nichols reportedly was called before a federal grand jury but declined to testify.

The native of Lapeer County was taken before the grand jury in Denver last week from his cell in the federal supermax prison in Florence, Colorado. It's unclear why grand jurors wanted to question Nichols.

The 50-year-old Nichols is serving a life sentence without parole for his role in the 1995 bombing of the Oklahoma City federal building. The blast killed 168 people.

Nichols has said he would cooperate with a congressional investigation into the bombing. California Republican Congressman Dana Rohrabacher is considering a probe, and is seeking to meet with Nichols in prison.

Nichols Won't Testify Before Grand Jury

OKLAHOMA CITY -- Oklahoma City bombing conspirator Terry Nichols was called before a federal grand jury in Denver last week but declined to testify, his ex-wife and sister said.

Nichols is serving a life sentence without parole for his role in the 1995 bombing that killed 168 people, but a new investigation is ongoing after FBI agents discovered explosives underneath his former house in Herington, Kan.

It was unclear why grand jurors were meeting or what they wanted to learn from Nichols during the appearance Thursday.

"It was very hush-hush," Nichols' ex-wife, Lana Padilla of Las Vegas, told The Oklahoman in a story published Wednesday. "He told us he went in front of the grand jury, and he was kind to the people and just said this was not the right forum, this is not where he could talk."

His sister, Susie McDonnell, said: "He refused ... and gave an explanation why."

U.S. Attorney Robert McCampbell in Oklahoma City said grand jury proceedings are confidential and he couldn't comment on the newspaper's report. Jeff Dorschner, a spokesman for the U.S. attorney in Colorado, also declined to comment.

In late March, agents discovered explosives under Nichols' old house, acting on information that came indirectly from another inmate, mobster Gregory Scarpa Jr. Nichols later complained in letters to victims that Scarpa had mixed the truth about the explosives with lies in an effort to get a reduced prison sentence.

Nichols, 50, has said he would cooperate with a congressional investigation. Rep. Dana Rohrabacher, R-Calif., is considering a probe into the bombing and is seeking to meet with Nichols in prison.

McDonnell said her brother does not feel safe at the federal supermax prison in Florence, Colo.

"He feels his life is very threatened," she said. Other inmates "have told him he has been marked as a snitch and marked for murder, and so he's very fearful for his life."

She blamed FBI misconduct for the problem but would not elaborate.

"His life has been put in danger, and we don't appreciate it," she said.

Synopsis: Document meeting with Terry Lynn Nichols on 05/27/05

Details: On 05/27/05, SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] interviewed Inmate Terry Lynn Nichols regarding the threat to Nichols' family. Nichols is serving multiple life terms for his role in the 1995 truck bombing of the Alfred P. Murray Federal Building, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Nichols is incarcerated at the United States Penitentiary - Administrative Maximum (ADX), 5880 Highway 67 South, Florence, Colorado.

Nichols advised that he did not trust managers from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and that he felt he was being manipulated. SA [redacted] explained that the purpose of the interview was to address the threat to Nichols' family, based on previous interviews. Nichols was asked if anything could be done to alleviate the threat to Nichols' family. Nichols clarified that a greater threat is actually to him directly versus his family. There are too many members in Nichols's family for someone to threaten. Nichols felt that upon revealing any information about co-conspirators, he would be harmed by the staff at ADX.

Nichols would like to meet with a Congressman as long as Nichols would be provided a copy of the transcript within seven days for his review. Nichols is aware that a Congressman has requested to interview Nichols regarding any connection between International Terrorism and the 1995 truck bombing.

Currently serving his ninth term in Congress, Dana Rohrabacher represents California's scenic 46th District. Stretching along the Pacific coastline of Orange County and Los Angeles from Huntington Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, the district includes Huntington Beach, Costa Mesa, Fountain Valley, Seal Beach, Santa Catalina Island, Midway City, Sunset Beach, Surfside, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes Estates and Rolling Hills Estates as well as portions of Long Beach, Westminster, Santa Ana and San Pedro, and Newport Beach.

Prior to his first election to Congress in 1988, Dana served as Special Assistant to President Reagan. For seven years he was one of the President's senior speechwriters. During his tenure at the White House, Rohrabacher played a pivotal role in the formulation of the Reagan Doctrine and in championing the cause of a strong national defense. He also helped formulate President Reagan's Economic Bill of Rights, a package of economic reforms that the President introduced in a historic speech before the Jefferson Memorial.

Congressman Rohrabacher is a senior member of the International Relations Committee. He serves as Vice Chairman of the Asia and the Pacific subcommittee and also sits on the newly created International Terrorism, Nonproliferation and Human Rights subcommittee. In both these positions he is a forceful advocate of America's international trade competitiveness and promotes maintaining a strong role for national security in U.S. foreign policy.

Rohrabacher is one of the committee's most outspoken advocates of human rights and democracy around the world. He is the leader each year in the effort to deny Normal Trade Relations status to China, a role he will continue to play until that communist government respects the human rights of its citizens, refrains from threatening its neighbors and lowers tariffs on American products. He is also an original co-sponsor of the Freedom from Religious Persecution Act, supports restitution by the Japanese government to Americans held prisoner during World War II and leads an annual effort to override authorization of U.S. taxpayer subsidies to communist Vietnam.

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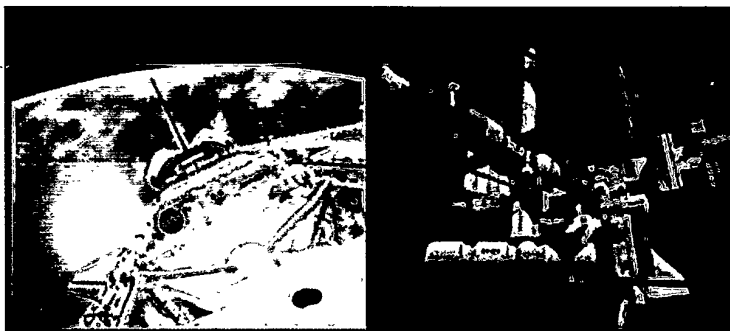
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advocate of strengthening America's technological leadership, especially in space and defense.

He quickly became the leading champion of so-called "Cheap Access to Space" and reusable launch vehicles, including the DC-X Single Stage Rocket Technology demonstrator, built in Huntington Beach by then-McDonnell Douglas.

In 1997, Congressman Rohrabacher became the chairman of the Space and Aeronautics Subcommittee. 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Nichols wants congressional inquiry into OKC bomb plot

Oklahoma City bombing conspirator Terry Nichols refused last week to testify before a federal grand jury in Denver but wants Congress to investigate the terrorist bomb attack that killed 168 people in 1995, his mother said Wednesday.

"He looks good, but he's full of fear right now," Joyce Wilt, 74, said in a telephone interview from her Michigan home a few days after visiting her son in prison in Colorado.

Wilt said Nichols and his family have received numerous death threats, including one in April that caused the FBI to post agents at Wilt's home for three days.

And last week, Wilt said, FBI agents walked Nichols down a cellblock corridor in view of other inmates at the federal prison in Florence where he is serving a life sentence. One inmate told her son later that he had been labeled a snitch and could be killed, Wilt said.

FBI spokesman Carl Schlaff in Denver said officers escorting inmates have no choice but to take them down cellblock halls.

"There are no secret entrances or exits," Schlaff said. "There are bars on the front of everybody's cell and it's in a hallway. Unless we can make a person disappear and then make them appear in another place, that's the way it has to be done.

"Other inmates can see what's going on. They're not fools."

On the other hand, just because the FBI talks to an inmate doesn't mean he's helping them.

"It's speculation by inmates whether another inmate is cooperating or not," Schlaff said.

A Colorado jury convicted Nichols in 1997 of conspiring with Timothy McVeigh to bomb Oklahoma City's Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building on April 19, 1995. The jury was unable to agree on whether Nichols should be condemned to die. He was then sentenced to life in prison without parole.

Last year, an Oklahoma jury convicted Nichols of murdering the people killed by the bomb in the rented Ryder truck that McVeigh parked in front of the Murrah Building. The jury decided Nichols should serve life in prison for those crimes instead of being executed.

In 1997, another Colorado jury convicted McVeigh of the bombing. He was executed in 2001.

Wilt said she visited her son during the weekend at the federal prison in Florence, along with Nichols' sister and his former wife.

"He's not suicidal," Wilt said. "We asked him. He said no."

Wilt said Nichols didn't know in advance that he was going to be taken before the federal grand jury in Denver last Thursday.

In recent news reports, Nichols has been quoted by third parties as implicating others in the bomb plot and expressing willingness to cooperate in an investigation.

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"They said, 'Well, here you have got the grand jury,' " Wilt said, "and he said no. He said it wasn't the proper timing and the proper format."

"He wanted an independent investigation of this by someone he can trust to come out with the truth, because he knows the FBI is doing a big cover-up," she said.

U.S. Rep. Dana Rohrabacher, R-Calif., may launch a congressional investigation, according to a report in the *Daily Oklahoman* on Wednesday.

Some recent reports mentioned Roger Moore, who was an Arkansas resident and gun collector at the time of the bombing, as a person involved in the plot.

Moore has denied involvement in the bombing.

Wilt said law enforcement authorities are "manipulating Terry, just like that Tim did. Tim scared the heck out of him with a gun all the time and threatened his family."

She said family members believe Nichols has Asperger syndrome, a neurobiological disorder related to autism, and that it makes him vulnerable to manipulation by others.

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OKC BOMBING: NEW REVELATIONS OF FEDERAL CRIMINAL CONDUCT

On May 10, 2005, attorney Jesse Trentadue gave a lengthy interview that was broadcast on KTOK talk radio news in Oklahoma City.

Trentadue made the following allegations and described his proof for the allegations:

McVeigh was trained at Elohim City in far Eastern OK by an FBI informant and operative in how to build the bomb used to blow up the Murrah building that killed 168 people on April 19, 1995.

McVeigh funded the OKC bombing with monies stolen from Midwest bank robberies that were directly aided by an FBI informant and operative, a member of the Midwest Bank robberies, and another individual who operated out of the FBI controlled Elohim City operation.

The FBI was directly complicit in the OKC bombing and the murder of 168 US citizens and was actively covering up the FBI involvement using a US Senator to continue the coverup. US Republican Senator Don Nickles from OK agreed to help the FBI cover up the murder of Jesse Trentadue's brother, Kenneth Trentadue at the OK Federal prison transfer center in OK in 1996 in order to also help cover up the FBI role in causing the OKC bombing. Trentadue has Freedom of Information Act request documents that reveal Senator Nickels criminal coverup role.

Trentadue cited a Federal judge ruling just announced that ordered the FBI to do a more thorough search of FBI records on the Kenny Trentadue murder, but not of the OKC bombing case which the FBI and DOJ have announced has been closed. The Federal judge gave the FBI until June 15, 2005 to complete its search. The judge excoriated FBI director Mueller. The judge accused the FBI of lying about FBI records in court related to Kenneth Trentadue's murder and the OKC bombing. The FBI also had filed an appeal with a Federal court trying to limit the requirements of the freedom of information act law to only allow one search of documents even though it was proven that the FBI is intentionally hiding documents in a separate facility, not logging many of these documents in FBI

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computer databases and misspelling names so they cannot be located in computer searches of FBI documents.

However, Congressman Rohrabacher still has not called for nor taken any significant action against the FBI for FBI gross misconduct in the handling of the Trentadue documents even though Rohrabacher received Jesse Trentadue's evidence and had promised to do much more than what he has done so far. There are those who have worked with Rohrabacher that now suspect Rohrabacker of betraying Trentadue to the FBI just as his fellow Congressman, US Republican Senator Don Nickles of OK. There are also other indications of Rohrabacker's betrayals to help the FBI in the OKC case that are described below.

One of the Midwest bank robbers, Richard Guthrie, knew McVeigh and closely resembled Kenneth Trentadue, and like Trentadue, was beaten to death and hung in his prison cell. FBI agents are strongly suspected in both of their murders. Trentadue and Guthrie were of similar weight, height and muscular build. They also had similar tattoos on the same places on their bodies. They both had been involved in bank robberies.

Another Midwest bank robber who operated out of Elohim City and who knew Guthrie and McVeigh was FBI and Secret Service operative/informant Peter Langan who seen with McVeigh's car and two other FBI informants in OKC at the Travelers Aid on April 18, 1995.

A third Midwest bank robber who worked for the FBI and Langan and Guthrie was a Mr. Linny of Cincinnati Ohio. A document obtained under a Freedom of Information Act request shows memos from FBI director Louis Freeh to a number of FBI field offices concerning FBI operatives Linny and Langan and the use of an FBI informant at Elohim City.

The FBI and CIA and US state Department operative and expert on explosives who trained McVeigh and lived out of Elohim City was German national Andreas Strassmeyer who was part of a joint effort by Louis Freeh and the German government in the US for over 6 years before the OKC bombing.

Jesse Trentadue took his information to California Congressman Rohrabacher who says he wants to investigate the OKC bombing but AVOID a hearing. Rohrabacher is strongly influenced by Rohrabacher's close Republican associates who were part of the OKC bombing coverup for the FBI- OK Senator Don Nickles, NJ Congressman James Saxton (House Task Force on Terrorism), OK Congressman Ernest Istook (House subcommittee on covert appropriations that would have funded the FBI OKC bombing operation), OK Senator Tom Coburn (close confidant of GW Bush and a Congressman with Istook at the time of the OKC bombing), and OK Senator James Inhofe who has alleged mob ties, ties to the Mena CIA drug operation with GW and HW Bush and who blocked the conviction of Clinton in the Senate trials.

Rohrabacker has asked Chicago attorney David Schippers to formally investigate the OKC bombing for Rohrabacker's investigations subcommittee on International Relations. Rohrabacker has also invited CIA director James Woolsey to testify before the subcommittee about the OKC bombing. But Woolsey's testimony is expected to be a limited hangout coverup, whitewash of the CIA role in the OKC bombing because of Woolsey's direct role in bringing McVeighs Iraqi helper, Al Hussain Husaini to OKC under HW Bush after the Gulf war in 1991. The FBI and CIA have protected Hussaini ever since the OKC bombing until Hussaini disappeared while being a baggage handler at Boston's Logan airport on 9/11. Woolsey is a confidant of attorney David Schippers and Woolsey fully vetted and thereby controlled and manipulated the content of Jayna Davis' flawed book on the OKC bombing, "The Third Terrorist."

Rohrabacher has pretended to be interested in meeting with OKC bomber Terry Nichols in prison to learn the details of the OKC bombing. But Rohrabacher's senior aide handling the OKC bombing investigation is Greg McCarthy, who once served with OK Senator James Inhofe when Inhofe was actively involved in covering up his knowledge of the FBI role in the OKC bombing and blocking the efforts of the Pentagon terror advisor, Jesse Clear, to expose this role.

Rohrabacher has claimed that the Federal bureau of prisons will not let Rohrabacher visit Nichols in prison to learn details of the OKC bombing since the prison bureau will only let people who knew Nichols before the bombing visit Nichols in prison. But Rohrabacher has deliberately avoided petitioning the Attorney General or GW Bush to permit even access to Terry Nichols in prison by people who knew Nichols before the OKC bombing, namely Nichols former wife Marife Nichols, son Josh Nichols, Nichols brother James Nichols or close family friend Bob Popovich.

Rohrabacher and his staff are strongly suspected of sabotaging investigators efforts to recover explosives in Terry Nichol's house last month that had been sold to McVeigh by FBI, CIA, Israeli intelligence operative and provocateur, Roger Moore. It is suspected that Rohrabacher's office tipped the FBI so that the FBI could recover the explosives before private investigators could recover them for independent verification of Moore's fingerprints on the explosives.

Roger Moore met and recruited McVeigh in Florida in 1993 while Moore worked with the FBI, CIA and Israeli intelligence monitoring the Islamic Jihad terrorist cells and mosques of AlArian, Jose Padilla (alleged radiation bomber) and Ramadan Sallah at WISE (World Islamic Studies) and the University of Southern Florida for over thirteen years. FBI agent Kerry Myers testified at the McVeigh trial but Myers was also involved in the 13year operation with Israeli Intelligence and the FBI and CIA associated with Roger Moore. The other man involved in the operation was William Northrup, who worked for US intelligence and Israeli intelligence at the same time with the full knowledge of both eh US and Israeli governments. Northrup came to OKC on April 17, 1995 from the Florida operation to warn the FBI in OKC on April 18, 1995 of a bomb attack on the OKC

federal complex sometime set for the same week. Northrup has been a 35 year friend of the US Pentagon terror advisor at the time of the OKC bombing, Jesse Clear, who like Northrup, has had ties directly to US and Israeli intelligence for 4 decades. Northrup has been a close confidant of KFORTV reporter Jayna Davis since before the OKC bombing.

Moore was also part of the FBI, DOJ, Freeh and Reno, orchestrated attempt to discredit militias in the mid 1990s. Moore traveled to the Montana Militia in 1994 in his mobile home with his live in girl friend Karen Anderson to try and sell heavy, illegal weapons to the Montana militia. The Montana militia investigated and learned of Moore's ties to Israeli intelligence, the CIA and FBI in Florida. Moore also built high-speed boats powered by nitromethane for the CIA and HW Bush confidant Don Aronaw. HW Bush purchased one of Moore's boats. Nitromethane is the ingredient of the binary explosive, Kenepak, that Moore sold to McVeigh for the Murrah bombing. Nitromethane was also included in the Ryder truck bomb transported by McVeigh.

Less than a year after the Nichols Federal trial, Moore recanted his entire testimony in a letter to federal prosecutors but nothing was ever done to Moore for his perjury even though Nichols defense attorney Michael Tigar complained bitterly about it in Nichols appeals hearing in July 1999. Roger Moore frequently used the alias Bob Miller in his letters to McVeigh encouraging McVeigh to attack the "New World Order". But Bob Miller's name was on the drivers license found in the Shawnee Mission locker of Midwest bank robber and FBI informant Peter Langan.

Others who live in California and are represented by Rohrabacher have told of Rohrabacher's previous betrayals of America to protect the illegal business dealings of the Communist Chinese with Rohrabacker's close Republican friends like HW Bush, GW Bush and OK Senator Don Nickles, the very man who agreed to help the FBI cover up the OKC bombing and Kenny Trentadue's murder according to Jesse Trentadue's documents. The Communist Chinese are the leading backers of terrorists groups and nations such as AlQaeda, Hamas and Hezbollah as well as Iran, Iraq, Syria and North Korea. Yet Rohrabacher, GW Bush and Rohrabacker's Republican Congressional friends involved in the OKC bombing and Trentadue murder cover up continue intentionally do nothing to address the Communist Chinese helping train, equip, provide, money safe haven and WMD technologies to these terrorist entities, including Bin Laden himself.

In another development, a government employee witness has now come forward to tell of a house rented by and frequented by McVeigh and Nichols in OKC and known about by the OKC FBI. The witness has been threatened by members of the federal government to not talk for over ten years.

A Grandmother's Grief

Ten years ago, Kathy Wilburn Sanders lost her grandsons in the Oklahoma City bombing.

Today she talks candidly about the pain of her loss and her faith in Christ.

On June 11, 2001, Timothy McVeigh was executed for his role in the deaths of 168 adults and children during the Oklahoma City bombing of the Murrah Building on April 19, 1995.

While his death brought closure to the tragedy for most Americans, for many, closure remains elusive. Among those is Kathy Wilburn Sanders, now 51, who lost grandsons Chase, 3, and Colton, 2, that day. Her daughter, Edye Smith, had dropped Chase and Colton off at the Murrah Building's on-site childcare center only a few blocks from where she and Kathy both worked. As shock waves rocked the neighboring buildings, Kathy and Edye ran to the federal building only to find a gaping hole where the daycare center once existed. They knew instinctively their babies were gone. That night, as Kathy and Edye watched the television coverage, a camera focused on a solitary blue sandal amidst the smoldering rubble—the one Chase had worn that morning.

Almost immediately, the media turned Chase and Colton's grieving mother and grandmother into visible symbols of a nation's grief. Then, disturbed by inconsistencies in the reports surrounding the bombing, Kathy and her husband, Glenn Wilburn, began aggressively investigating it on their own in an effort to make sense of the tragedy that forever changed their lives.

Today Kathy, who has since remarried after Glenn's death in 1997, writes about her experiences in investigating the facts behind the bombing in *After Oklahoma City* (Master Strategies Publishing). And on its tenth anniversary, Kathy shares how her faith in Christ survived this trial intact—and has made an impact on others.

What prompted you to write this book?

Eighteenth-century British statesman Edmund Burke once said that evil flourishes when good men do nothing. Glenn and I both felt we needed to do something—to find out as much about the bombing as we could. We felt we owed that to Chase and Colton. During all those years of traveling and interviewing different people—including members of the Aryan Nation—I kept journals. People encouraged me to turn them into a book.

What emotions did its writing dredge up for you?

My emotions have been like a roller coaster. The sweet memories of my precious grandsons, Chase and Colton, are always close to the surface. Even ten years later, those memories bring tears to my eyes. I've found most people don't understand those tears. But if you've lost a loved one, especially a child, you want to keep his or her memory alive.

Nothing compares to the death of a child. A piece of you dies with that child. When I watched those babies being lowered into the ground, my faith in Christ was shaken. Glenn and I heard parents of children who survived say on TV, "We asked God to

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keep our little boy safe, and he answered our prayers." Well, we prayed for our boys, too—and we lost them both.

So you struggled with belief in God's goodness?

Yes. The night we buried my grandchildren, I argued with God: "I prayed for Chase and Colton; I asked you to watch over them and keep them safe. Why did you let this happen?" Every Scripture I ever memorized flew through my mind, such as John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." *God, this is your love for me? You loved the world so much you did this?*

Glenn was so angry with the Lord. He would tell you flat-out no loving God would allow this to happen. Two years after the bombing, he died of pancreatic cancer. I think he really died of a broken heart. Thankfully, in the 11 months it took Glenn to die, he made peace with God.

At the time, Edye had more faith than I. She'd say, "I know I'm going to see my children again in heaven." But I thought, *Maybe I've been wrong all these years. Maybe those little boys are just going to rot in the ground.* For the first time in my life, I thought about killing myself.

What stopped you?

I didn't want to add to Edye and Glenn's misery. But I prayed to die. I wanted to die.

Then one day John Walsh of television's *America's Most Wanted* spoke to a group of survivors. Walsh, whose son, Adam, had been murdered, pointed his finger in our faces and said, "You will grieve deeply, but you *will* survive." That gave me hope. I realized a time of crisis isn't the time to lose your faith; it's the time to *use* it.

We went through major stuff. But when I eventually quit asking "why?", I began experiencing peace. It's been a long journey toward healing. I think it's best described this way: If you suddenly lost your eyesight, you'd get up every morning and still mourn the fact you couldn't see the beautiful sunrise. You now have a life you didn't want or choose, but it can still be a good life, a blessed life. You learn to adapt to it. That's what I've done.

How did you feel God's comfort in this ordeal?

For the first month after the bombing, a group of people from our church brought us dinner every night. For a *month!* But we didn't just feel God's love expressed to us by the church; we felt the love of a nation. We got so many cards and letters.

But some well-intentioned friends said things like, "Well, Chase and Colton are in a better place now. They're with Jesus." That didn't bring any comfort—I wanted them home with *me!* I've learned it's better to tell grieving people you're sorry and to love them. Sometimes there aren't any words to fix a situation.

I used to be the same way. I'd sugarcoat the gospel by glibly saying, "Just give it to the Lord." Or I'd tell God what I needed, as though I had the authority to give *him* an assignment! But I began praying, "Show me, Lord, what you want me to do. Show me how to work through this." That prayer spurred me into action—like

corresponding with convicted criminal Timothy McVeigh and co-conspirator Terry Nichols.

You corresponded with your grand-babies' killers?

Yes, I wrote to Timothy McVeigh. I met his father and his sister. I wanted to learn everything I could about him because I wondered, *How did this young man get so twisted?* But he never responded to my letters.

After my husband died, I went to Terry Nichols's trial on my quest to learn everything I could about the bombing. But somewhere along the way, things started changing. At Nichols's trial I saw this woman off by herself; I found out she was Terry Nichols's mother, Joyce. I introduced myself and said, "I'm so sorry about what's happened to your family." We began to eat lunch together, and as our friendship developed, Terry slowly transformed from Terry the Bomber to Terry, Joyce's son. One day he looked at me in the courtroom; our eyes met, and I didn't know what to do. So I mouthed, "Hi, Terry."

I ended up visiting him in prison, hoping he would tell me what he's told no one else about the bombing. I wanted Terry to come to terms with what he did and tell me because it's the right thing to do.

It's amazing you reached out to the perpetrator's family when your pain was still so raw.

This was nothing I'd planned to do or that I'd even particularly prayed to do. It was just something that took place in my heart.

For example, Terry Nichols's son, Josh, was 12 at the time of the bombing. I got to know him and his mother, Terry's ex-wife, Lana Padilla, during Timothy McVeigh's trial, so I invited them to stay with me if they ever came to Oklahoma City.

A few months later, the doorbell rang, and there were Josh and Lana. They ended up staying with me for four days. Josh and I really hit it off, and on the third day, Josh asked me to take him to the memorial site. It was the weirdest thing—to visit Chase and Colton's memorial with the bomber's son.

Before they left, they wanted to take Edye out to eat. Later, after she left, Josh shook his head. "I don't believe it," he said. "Edye said she liked me—and she even seemed to like my dad, too." I said, "Josh, Edye and I are Christians, and our Bible tells us that the Lord wants us to forgive others as he's forgiven us." I added, "I've written your dad and told him I don't know what his part in that bombing was, but whatever it was, I've forgiven him."

Josh was another victim of the bombing; he was a very troubled young man who was made fun of at his school and nicknamed "bomber."

I saw Josh last summer, when Nichols's Oklahoma trial was held. This time Josh didn't have that wild, crazy look in his eyes. Lana said he'd given his heart to the Lord and turned his life around. How awesome!

People who've suffered often have more compassion for others who suffer. Before the bombing, when I'd see something on TV like a plane crash, I'd say, "Oh, that's

too bad." Then I'd change the channel. Now when I see devastation on TV—like what happened on September 11—it stays with me. I know it's not only about who's dead; it's also about all those left behind.

Do you ever feel as though 9/11 overshadowed the Oklahoma City bombing?

The devastation of 9/11 was like nothing I've ever seen. But that doesn't make our losses any less significant.

I was invited to be on the *Today* show in Manhattan the day the planes started flying again. I flew in over the smoldering ruins of the World Trade Center and was taken to Ground Zero, where I had the opportunity to talk with firefighters and policemen.

What did you tell them?

I wanted the people of New York to know they *would* survive. I'd been in their shoes; at the time I didn't know if I could survive, but I did.

What do you hope your book will accomplish?

I hope it offers hope and comfort to others. I want people to see that without the Lord, I wouldn't have made it. God's grace *is* sufficient. People say, "Oh, I couldn't do what you've done." Well, you could. There's nothing special about me. But you don't have that kind of grace until you need it.

When I look back at it, I'm appalled at my audacity in demanding answers from an all-powerful God. Things happen that we don't understand, that we have no answers for. But it's OK to admit we don't have the answers.

Just because we ask Jesus into our life doesn't mean we're never going to have problems. But in my journey beyond despair, I've seen how the Lord has protected and directed me. And I can still approach God's throne of grace and love and adore him.

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
